A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The rental housing revolving fund is
3	established under section 201H-202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to
4	provide loans or grants for the development, pre-development,
5	construction, acquisition, preservation, and substantial
6	rehabilitation of rental housing units.
7	The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds to the
8	rental housing revolving fund.
9	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
11	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to be
1 2	deposited into the rental housing revolving fund.
13	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the rental housing
14	revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may
15	be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the purposes
16	specified in section 201H-202, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

5	SECT	ION 4. The legislature finds that housing first
6	programs	are a collaborative effort between the department of
7	human ser	vices and the United States Department of Housing and
8	Urban Dev	elopment that provides housing and support services for
9	chronical	ly homeless individuals, including those who have an
10	addiction	or mental illness, or both. The principles of housing
11	first pro	grams include:
12	(1)	Moving chronically homeless individuals into housing
13		directly from the streets and shelters without a
14		precondition of accepting or complying with treatment;
15	(2)	Providing robust support services for program
16		participants that are predicated on assertive
17		engagement rather than coercion;
18	(3)	Granting chronically homeless individuals priority as
19		program participants in housing first programs;

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(4) Embracing a harm-reduction approach to addictions
rather than mandating abstinence while supporting
program participant commitments to recovery; and
(5) Providing program participants with leases and tenant
protections as provided by law.

Housing first is a nationally recognized best practice and 6 has been proven to be an effective approach to helping people 7 experiencing chronic homelessness get off of the streets in 8 several cities. In Portland, Oregon, the housing first program 9 helped reduce the number of chronically homeless people sleeping 10 outside by seventy per cent. In Los Angeles, California, for 11 each chronically homeless person placed in housing first, Los 12 Angeles saved \$80,000 over two years. Similar results in 13 Denver, Colorado; Quincy, Massachusetts; and Portland, Maine 14 show that housing first is effective in reducing chronic 15 homelessness. Currently, the housing first program only serves 16 17 the island of Oahu, despite the needs of individuals on neighboring islands. 18

19 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds to the 20 department of human services to support the State's housing 21 first programs in assisting the Hawaii residents living on the

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1	neighbor islands who are chronically homeless and who are often
2	the most vulnerable, most visible, and most difficult to serve.
3	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
6	continued implementation of the State's housing first program
7	and expansion of the program to the neighbor islands to assist
8	residents who are chronically homeless.
9	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
10	human services for the purposes of this part.

12	SECTION 6. The legislature finds that the Hawaii public
13	housing authority is the sole statewide public housing agency of
14	the State. The Hawaii public housing authority's portfolio of
15	eighty-five properties comprises 6,195 units that serve over
16	6,100 families, or more than 20,000 individuals. \cdot

4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

6	the repair and maintenance of the Hawaii public housing
7	authority's existing public housing stock.
8	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
9	housing authority for the purposes of this part.

10	and for program and administrative costs associated with
11	establishing and operating the rapid re-housing program shall be
12	expended by the department of human services through a contract
13	issued pursuant to chapter 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for
14	the purposes of this part.
