A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The rental housing revolving fund is
3	established under section 201H-202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to
4	provide loans or grants for the development, pre-development,
5	construction, acquisition, preservation, and substantial
6	rehabilitation of rental housing units.
7	The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds to the
8	rental housing revolving fund.
9	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
11	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to be
12	deposited into the rental housing revolving fund.
13	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the rental housing
14	revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may
15	be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the purposes
16	specified in section 201H-202, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

1	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
2	housing f	inance and development corporation for the purposes of
3	this part	•

5	SECT	ION 4. The legislature finds that housing first
6	programs	are a collaborative effort between the department of
7	human ser	vices and the United States Department of Housing and
8	Urban Dev	elopment that provides housing and support services for
9	chronical	ly homeless individuals, including those who have an
10	addiction	or mental illness, or both. The principles of housing
11	first pro	grams include:
12	(1)	Moving chronically homeless individuals into housing
13		directly from the streets and shelters without a
14		precondition of accepting or complying with treatment;
15	(2)	Providing robust support services for program
16		participants that are predicated on assertive
17		engagement rather than coercion;
18	(3)	Granting chronically homeless individuals priority as
19		program participants in housing first programs;

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1	(4) Embracing a harm-reduction approach to addictions		
2	rather than mandating abstinence while supporting		
3	program participant commitments to recovery; and		
4	(5) Providing program participants with leases and tenant		
5	protections as provided by law.		
6	Housing first is a nationally recognized best practice and		
7	has been proven to be an effective approach to helping people		
8	experiencing chronic homelessness get off of the streets in		
9	several cities. In Portland, Oregon, the housing first program		
10	helped reduce the number of chronically homeless people sleeping		
11	outside by seventy per cent. In Los Angeles, California, for		
12	each chronically homeless person placed in housing first, Los		
13	Angeles saved \$80,000 over two years. Similar results in		
14	Denver, Colorado; Quincy, Massachusetts; and Portland, Maine		
15	show that housing first is effective in reducing chronic		
16	homelessness. Currently, the housing first program only serves		
17	the island of Oahu, despite the needs of individuals on		
18	neighboring islands.		
19	The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds to the		
20	department of human services to support the State's housing		
21	first programs in assisting the Hawaii residents living on the		

- 1 neighbor islands who are chronically homeless and who are often
- 2 the most vulnerable, most visible, and most difficult to serve.
- 3 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
- 6 continued implementation of the State's housing first program
- 7 and expansion of the program to the neighbor islands to assist
- 8 residents who are chronically homeless.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 human services for the purposes of this part.
- 11 PART III
- 12 SECTION 6. The legislature finds that the Hawaii public
- 13 housing authority is the sole statewide public housing agency of
- 14 the State. The Hawaii public housing authority's portfolio of
- 15 eighty-five properties comprises 6,195 units that serve over
- 16 6,100 families, or more than 20,000 individuals.
- 17 The Hawaii public housing authority's aging housing stock
- 18 continues to have an extensive, capital need that is underfunded
- 19 by the United States Department of Housing and Urban
- 20 Development. Additional funding is needed to modernize, repair,
- 21 and maintain many of the State's public housing units.

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1 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds to improve 2 the quality of existing public housing stock in the State and to 3 authorize the establishment and filling of one full-time 4 equivalent position to assist in the administration of the rent 5 supplement program. 6 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for 9 the repair and maintenance of the Hawaii public housing 10 authority's existing public housing stock. 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public 12 housing authority for the purposes of this part. 13 SECTION 8. From fiscal year 2016-2017, the governor may establish and the Hawaii public housing authority may fill 1.00 14 full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) public housing specialist II 15 16 position within the Hawaii public housing authority to assist in 17 the administration of the rent supplement program pursuant to 18 part VIII of chapter 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes; provided 19 that the personal services cost of the position shall be funded 20 from the base budget of the rent supplement program; provided

further that the rent supplement program shall coordinate

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1	addiciona	i services of case management, illiancial literacy, and

4	SECT	ION 9. There is appropriated out of the general	
5	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
6	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for a	
7	rental as	sistance program, also known as the rapid re-housing	
8	program,	within the department of human services, for homeless	
9	working i	ndividuals and their families who are ready to rent	
10	permanent housing to obtain and maintain permanent housing;		
11	provided that:		
12	(1)	The maximum subsidy shall be \$500 per month and to	
13		qualify for the subsidy, a household shall pay a	
14		minimum of forty per cent of their adjusted gross	
15		income for rent; and	
16	(2)	A household's adjusted gross income shall be	
17		calculated in the same manner as calculated by the	
18		Hawaii public housing authority to qualify for public	
19		housing under the authority's control.	

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of

human services for the purposes of this part; provided that the

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- 1 sum appropriated for staff within the homeless programs office
- 2 and for program and administrative costs associated with
- 3 establishing and operating the rapid re-housing program shall be
- 4 expended by the department of human services through a contract
- 5 issued pursuant to chapter 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for
- 6 the purposes of this part.

- 8 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
