A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC LEAKAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's economy
- 2 is heavily dependent on the tourism industry. While there have
- 3 been a variety of attempts to diversify Hawaii's economy in
- 4 industries other than tourism, the tourism industry remains the
- 5 largest industry in the State. Due to the importance of tourism
- 6 to the State's economy, the legislature finds that it is crucial
- 7 for its members to have access to a breadth of information
- 8 relating to the tourism moneys that enter, and potentially
- 9 leave, the State.
- 10 The legislature further finds that economic leakage occurs
- 11 when revenue generated by an industry is not retained in the
- 12 State's economy, but instead, is lost to foreign economies.
- 13 Currently, the amount of the State's economic leakage in the
- 14 tourism industry is unknown. Certain foods, souvenirs, jewelry,
- 15 and other products imported to Hawaii for the purpose of
- 16 supporting the tourism industry are notable sources of economic
- 17 leakage in the State. However, some economic leakage is

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- 1 unavoidable as certain products cannot be sourced locally.
- 2 Additionally, not all economic leakage is detrimental to the
- 3 State's economy as certain leakage in one industry may prompt
- 4 increased spending in other industries. Information identifying
- 5 linkages between the State's economic leakage in the tourism
- 6 industry and local non-tourism industries can help policy makers
- 7 develop strategies to strengthen and diversify the State's
- 8 economy.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 10 business, economic development, and tourism to prepare a report
- 11 that examines linkages between the State's tourism industry and
- 12 other local industries of the State for the purpose of reducing
- 13 economic leakage and improving the State's economic input-output
- 14 model.
- 15 SECTION 2. The department of business, economic
- 16 development, and tourism shall prepare a report examining
- 17 linkages between the State's tourism industry and other local
- 18 industries of the State for the purpose of reducing economic
- 19 leakage and improving the State's economic input-output model.
- 20 SECTION 3. The department of business, economic
- 21 development, and tourism shall submit a report of its findings

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- 1 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
- 2 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 3 the regular session of 2017.
- 4 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 7 preparation of a report on the linkages between the State's
- 8 tourism industry and other local industries of the State for the
- 9 purpose of reducing economic leakage and improving the State's
- 10 economic input-output model.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 13 this Act.
- 14 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2120.
