A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PREAUDITS OF PROPOSED PAYMENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 40-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 3 "(b) With respect to the executive branch, except the
- 4 University of Hawaii until June 30, 2016, the Hawaii tourism
- 5 authority, and the department of education until June 30,
- 6 [2015,] 2020, the comptroller shall have complete supervision of
- 7 all accounts. The comptroller shall preaudit all proposed
- 8 payments of \$10,000 or more to determine the propriety of
- 9 expenditures and compliance with executive orders and rules that
- 10 may be in effect. When necessary, the comptroller shall
- 11 withhold approval of any payment. Whenever approval is
- 12 withheld, the department or agency concerned shall be promptly
- 13 notified. With respect to the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii
- 14 tourism authority, and the department of education, the
- 15 comptroller shall issue warrants for the release of funds for
- 16 the operating costs of the university, the Hawaii tourism
- 17 authority, or the department of education, as applicable, in

- 1 The University of Hawaii and the department of education shall
- 2 preaudit all proposed payments of \$10,000 or more and shall
- 3 preaudit samples of the population of proposed payments of less
- 4 than \$10,000; provided that the sample size comprises at least
- 5 five per cent of the population, and is of a size that the chief
- 6 financial officers of the University of Hawaii and the
- 7 department of education, as applicable, determine appropriate,
- 8 to determine the propriety of expenditures and compliance with
- 9 applicable laws, executive orders, and rules. The Hawaii
- 10 tourism authority shall preaudit all proposed payments to
- 11 determine the propriety of expenditures and compliance with
- 12 applicable laws, executive orders, and rules as may be in
- 13 effect. The University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority,
- 14 and the department of education shall make disbursements for
- 15 operating expenses from the amounts released by the comptroller
- 16 and maintain records and documents necessary to support those
- 17 disbursements at times mutually agreed upon by the university
- 18 president, the executive director of the Hawaii tourism
- 19 authority, or the superintendent of education, as applicable,
- 20 and the comptroller; provided that when requested by the
- 21 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of

- 1 education, the comptroller shall make all disbursements for the
- 2 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of
- 3 education, as applicable, subject to available allotment. Funds
- 4 released pursuant to this section shall be deposited by the
- 5 university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or department of
- 6 education, as applicable, in accordance with the provisions
- 7 applicable to the director of finance by chapter 38. Except for
- 8 moneys deposited by the Hawaii tourism authority in the
- 9 convention center enterprise special fund pursuant to section
- 10 201B-8, and in the tourism special fund pursuant to section
- 11 201B-11, any interest earned on the deposit of funds released
- 12 pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the state
- 13 treasury at the end of each fiscal year."

- 18 amended by section 5 of Act 102, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, is
- 19 amended by amending section 14 to read as follows:
- "SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
