## A BILL FOR AN ACT

SECTION 1. Section 40-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

RELATING TO THE PREAUDITS OF PROPOSED PAYMENTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 With respect to the executive branch, except the 4 University of Hawaii until June 30, 2016, the Hawaii tourism 5 authority, and the department of education [until June 30, 6 2015], the comptroller shall have complete supervision of all 7 accounts. The comptroller shall preaudit all proposed payments 8 of \$10,000 or more to determine the propriety of expenditures 9 and compliance with executive orders and rules that may be in effect. When necessary, the comptroller shall withhold approval 10 of any payment. Whenever approval is withheld, the department 11 12 or agency concerned shall be promptly notified. With respect to 13 the University of Hawaii, the Hawaii tourism authority, and the 14 department of education, the comptroller shall issue warrants 15 for the release of funds for the operating costs of the

university, the Hawaii tourism authority, or the department of

education, as applicable, in amounts and at times mutually
