RELATING TO CITATIONS FOR MASSAGE THERAPY VIOLATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 452, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§452-</u> Citation for licensee violations; fines. (a) In		
5	addition to any other remedy available under this chapter, the		
6	department of commerce and consumer affairs may issue a citation		
7	to any person who holds a license issued by the board for any of		
8	the following:		
9	(1) Failure of a massage therapy establishment to		
10	conspicuously display a current massage therapy		
11	establishment license and the current licenses and		
12	permits of all persons employed by the massage therapy		
13	establishment;		
14	(2) Failure of an apprentice to wear a conspicuously		
15	placed name tag stating the apprentice's name and the		
16	word "apprentice";		



1	(3)	Operation of a massage therapy establishment without a
2		licensed principal massage therapist or licensed
3		designee in attendance on the premises at all times;
4		or
5	(4)	Failure of a massage therapist or massage therapy
6		establishment to include the respective massage
7		therapist's or massage therapy establishment's current
8		license number in any advertisement.
9	(b)	Each citation:
10	(1)	Shall be in writing and describe the basis of the
11		citation, including the specific statute or rule
12		violated;
13	(2)	May contain an order of abatement and the assessment
14		of a fine in the amount of \$250 for each violation;
15	(3)	Shall be served on the licensee by personal service;
16		and
17	(4)	Shall inform the licensee that the licensee may submit
18		a written request to the board for a hearing to
19		contest the citation, within twenty calendar days from
20		the service of the citation.
21	(c)	If the licensee timely submits a written request to

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1	the board for a hearing, the board may designate a hearings		
2	officer to conduct the hearing in accordance with chapter 91.		
3	(d) If the licensee does not timely submit a written		
4	request to the board for a hearing, the citation shall be deemed		
5	a final order of the board.		
6	(e) Failure of a licensee to pay any assessed fine within		
7	thirty calendar days, unless the licensee contests the citation,		
8	may result in further disciplinary action taken by the board."

Report Title: Citations; Massage Therapy Violations; Fines

Description:

Authorizes the issuance of a citation for specific violations of massage therapy laws by licensees. Sets forth a process for licensees to contest the citation and provides for the assessment of fines for each violation.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Commerce and Consumer Affairs

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CITATIONS FOR MASSAGE THERAPY VIOLATIONS.

PURPOSE: To authorize the issuance of citations to licensees who violate specific massage therapy laws.

MEANS: Add a new section to chapter 452, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION: Citations for unlicensed massage therapy activity are authorized under section 436B-26.5, HRS. Currently, there is no mechanism to issue citations for licensee conduct that violates chapter 452, HRS. This bill seeks to establish a citation process as an alternative means for the Massage Therapy Board (Board) to address specific massage therapy violations.

> The bill also requires personal service of the citation upon the licensee and affords the licensee the opportunity to submit a written request for a hearing to contest the citation within twenty calendar days. The bill also provides that failure to pay any assessed fine within thirty calendar days may subject the licensee to further disciplinary action.

> The citation process created in this bill will expedite enforcement of and promote swift compliance with massage therapy laws. The bill also will allow investigative staff to focus efforts and resources on more serious massage therapy violations.

Impact on the public: The public will benefit from quick enforcement against certain violations of the massage therapy laws. Page 2



Impact on the department and other agencies: The bill will improve the Department's ability to address technical, less serious massage therapy violations. No impact upon other agencies is anticipated.
