RELATING TO EXEMPTIONS FROM CIVIL SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Description:

Restores the second civil service-exempt deputy director position for the department of human services. For a period of three years, authorizes the department of health to establish 18 exempt forensic psychologist positions and 2 exempt Hawaii state hospital primary care physician positions. For a period of three years, provides a civil service exemption for various positions in the department of human services, department of public safety, department of health, department of labor and industrial relations, and department of business, economic development, and tourism.
