A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ETHICS TRAINING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§84- Definitions.</u> As used in this part, unless the
5	context requires otherwise:
6	"Ethics training" means education and training in the
7	ethics laws set forth in this chapter."
8	SECTION 2. Section 84-41, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"§84-41 Applicability of part. This part applies to
11	[legislators, members of the board of education, trustees of the
12	office of Hawaiian affairs, the governor, the licutenant
13	governor, and executive department heads and deputies. This
14	part-does not apply to any other officer-or-employee-of-the
15	State.] all persons required to file a financial disclosure
16	statement pursuant to section 84-17(d); all members of a board,
17	as defined in section 92-2; state employees responsible for



1	procurement; state employees who administer state contracts; and
2	state employees who regulate or inspect private organizations."
3	SECTION 3. Section 84-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"[+]§84-42[+] Mandatory ethics training course. (a) All
6	[state-officers and employees] persons enumerated in section
7	84-41 shall complete [an] <u>a course in</u> ethics training [course],
8	as defined in section 84- , administered by the state ethics
9	commission as provided in this part[. For the purposes of this
10	part, "ethics training" includes education and training in:
11	(1) The ethics laws set forth in this chapter; and
12	(2) The lobbying laws set forth in chapter 97.], within
13	thirty days of taking office or an employee's first day of
14	employment, and once every four years thereafter.
15	(b) All persons who are required to file a financial
16	disclosure statement pursuant to section 84-17(d) shall attend
17	an ethics training course in person.
18	(c) All members of a board, as defined in section 92-2,
19	and not included in section 84-17(d); state employees
20	responsible for procurement; state employees who administer
21	state contracts; and state employees who regulate or inspect



1	private organizations shall complete an online ethics training
2	course."
3	SECTION 4. Section 84-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"[+]§84-43[+] Ethics training course. (a) The state
6	ethics commission shall establish, design, supervise, and
7	conduct in-person and online ethics training courses, designed
8	specifically for the [officers and employees] persons to whom
9	this part applies.
10	(b) The ethics training course shall include:
11	(1) Explanations and discussions of the ethics laws,
12	administrative rules, [and] relevant internal
13	policies $[7]$, and consequences for violations of ethics
14	laws;
15	(2) Additional information and clarification regarding
16	standards of conduct; compensation, gifts, and other
17	items of value; prohibited representations; conflicts
18	of interest; campaign and political activity
19	restrictions; contracts; disclosure of confidential
20	information; and abuse of office;
21	[(2)] (3) Specific technical and legal requirements;

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1	[-(3) -]	(4) The underlying purposes and principles of ethics
2		laws;
3	[-(4) -]	(5) Examples of practical application of the laws and
4		principles; and
5	[(5)]	(6) A question-and-answer [participatory] segment
6		regarding common problems and situations.
7	The state	ethics commission shall develop the methods and
8	prepare a	ny materials necessary to establish, implement, and
9	administe	r the ethics training course.
10	(c)	The state ethics commission shall:
11	(1)	[Administer the] Develop, implement, and administer an
12		ethics training course;
13	(2)	Designate those of its legal staff who are to conduct
14		the <u>in-person</u> ethics training course; and
15	(3)	Notify each [officer or employee] person enumerated in
16		section 84-41 that their <u>in-person</u> attendance in this
17		course or online completion of this course, as
18		applicable, is mandatory.
19	(d)	The <u>in-person and online</u> ethics training [course]
20	courses s	hall [be-held in January of each year for those who
21	have not	attended the course previously. The course shall last

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1	at least two hours in length.] be made available on a regular
2	basis for each person enumerated in section 84-42(b) and on an
3	ongoing basis for each person enumerated in section 84-42(c).
4	[(e) The state ethics commission may repeat the course as
5	necessary to accommodate all persons who are required to attend.
6	(f) (e) Each state agency shall provide to the state
7	ethics commission the names of those required to take the course
8	[in a timely manner and assist-the commission by providing
9	adequate meeting facilities for the ethics training course.] and
10	provide each person enumerated in section 84-41 with sufficient
11	time to comply with the requirements of section 84-42."
12	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.

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Report Title:

State Ethics Commission; Mandatory Online and In-person Ethics Training Course; Public Officials; Employees

Description:

Requires the state ethics commission to offer a more comprehensive ethics training course that is to be completed by persons subject to section 84-41, HRS, within thirty days of taking office or starting employment and once every four years thereafter. Requires all persons required to file a financial disclosure statement pursuant to section 84-17(d), HRS, to attend an in-person ethics course and all members of a board, as defined in section 92-2 and not included in section 84-17(d); state employees responsible for procurement; state employees who administer state contracts; and state employees who regulate or inspect private organizations to complete an online ethics course. Takes effect on July 1, 2016.
