The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the transfer of 7 moneys from University of Hawaii special and revolving funds, or 8 general funds that were appropriated to the University of Hawaii 9 for other purposes, for the purpose of funding construction 10 11 projects that are not explicitly authorized by the legislature. SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 15 "Salah Special and revolving funds; general fund 16 appropriations; unauthorized construction projects; prohibition.
