# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER CONTAMINATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is home to

2 the best beaches and marine life in the world, with millions of

3 visitors coming each year to swim, surf, snorkel, scuba dive,

4 and sunbathe on our shores. As such, the State must be a good

5 steward of the land and sea by protecting Hawaii's habitats and

6 ecosystems for future generations. Hawaii's terrestrial and

7 marine life may be threatened from imprudent past and present

practices that may be affecting the quality of the State's

9 waters.

10 The department of health, in collaboration with the

department of agriculture and United States Geological Survey

12 Cooperative, responded to public concerns about pesticide use

13 with a statewide pesticide sampling pilot project of twenty-four

14 sites to determine the pesticide levels present at a single

15 point in time. However, more information is needed on the water

16 quality to determine any correlation or causation of adverse

17 effects to marine life.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation to the
- 2 department of health and department of agriculture for a joint
- 3 water-quality study of the water resources, including but not
- 4 limited to ground water, surface water, and adjacent marine
- 5 waters, of the Waialua district on the island of Oahu.
- 6 SECTION 2. (a) The department of health and department of
- 7 agriculture shall collaborate to conduct a water-quality
- 8 pesticide sampling study of the water resources, including but
- 9 not limited to ground water, surface water, and adjacent marine
- 10 waters, of the Waialua district on the island of Oahu; provided
- 11 that the departments may, in their discretion, consult and
- 12 partner with other relevant government and non-government
- 13 agencies, organizations, businesses, experts, and individuals in
- 14 their analysis.
- 15 (b) The department of health and department of agriculture
- 16 shall sample and test for any pesticides, pollutants, and toxic
- 17 chemicals no less than two times per month for twelve
- 18 consecutive months.
- 19 (c) The department of health and department of agriculture
- 20 shall update their water-quality plan to the extent necessary to
- 21 describe the present scope of the water quality in the Waialua

- 1 district on the island of Oahu and any recommendations related
- 2 to policy, programs, and funding to address water-quality
- 3 concerns.
- 4 (d) The department of health and department of agriculture
- 5 may contract for the services of another entity to perform
- 6 economic modeling or any related services that may be required
- 7 pursuant to this Act. Any contract for services executed
- 8 pursuant to this Act shall be exempt from chapter 103D, Hawaii
- 9 Revised Statutes.
- (e) The department of health and department of agriculture
- 11 shall submit the study to the legislature no later than twenty
- 12 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2018.
- 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to conduct
- 16 a water-quality study of the water resources, including but not
- 17 limited to ground water, surface water, and adjacent marine
- 18 waters, of the Waialua district on the island of Oahu.

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of health and department of agriculture for the purposes of this
- 3 Act.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
