A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The State of Hawaii employs numerous

2 individuals whose responsibilities include law enforcement.

3 Many state departments, including the department of public

4 safety, department of transportation, department of land and

5 natural resources, and department of the attorney general,

6 employ individuals who maintain police powers and are often

7 called upon to perform law enforcement duties and

8 investigations. Some of these individuals include harbor police

9 officers of the department of transportation, deputy sheriffs of

10 the department of public safety, and division of conservation

11 and resources' enforcement officers of the department of land

12 and natural resources. However, no standardized law enforcement

13 training for all state employees with law enforcement duties

currently exists, thus requiring some state departments to hire

personnel from other law enforcement agencies who have already

16 received law enforcement training from those elsewhere. This

17 results in a limited pool of applicants from which personnel can

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- 1 be hired, thereby creating vacancies in these departments. The
- 2 legislature finds that creating a state law enforcement training
- 3 academy would help in recruiting personnel for law enforcement
- 4 positions within state government as well as standardize law
- 5 enforcement training among various state departments and
- 6 agencies.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to establish a state law
- 8 enforcement training academy within the department of public
- 9 safety.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 353C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 "PART . STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING ACADEMY
- 14 §353C- State law enforcement training academy;
- 15 established. (a) The state law enforcement training academy is
- 16 established within the department of public safety for the
- 17 training of all candidates to become law enforcement officers in
- 18 the State and the retraining of current law enforcement officers
- 19 in the State. The state law enforcement training academy shall
- 20 be maintained and operated by the department.

1	(b) The director shall administer the state law
2	enforcement training academy and shall establish standards for
3	admission and courses of training. The director shall adopt
4	rules under chapter 91 relating to:
5	(1) The admission, education, physical standards, and
6	personal character of the trainees; and
7	(2) Such other rules that are not inconsistent with law.
8	§353C- Location of training academy. The state law
9	enforcement training academy shall be located in Waipahu, Oahu,
10	at the present location of the Honolulu police department
11	training academy, unless the director with the consent of the
12	governor determines a more suitable alternate site.
13	§353C- Persons admissible to training academy;
14	qualifications. All persons admitted to the state law
15	enforcement training academy shall:
16	(1) Be a candidate to become a duly sworn law enforcement
17	officer of the State as verified by the department to
18	which the candidate has applied;
19	(2) Meet all the qualifications necessary to be appointed

as a duly sworn law enforcement officer of the State

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1		for the particular position the individual is a	
2		candidate for;	
3	(3)	Be a citizen of the United States and a resident of	
4		the State; and	
5	(4)	Be certified by a physician as being physically and	
6		mentally sound on an examination made within one month	
7		prior to the acceptance of the person's candidacy.	
8	§353	C- Certificate of completion of training course.	
9	Upon the	satisfactory completion of the prescribed course of	
10	training,	the director shall issue to each candidate a	
11	certifica	tion of the candidate's qualifications for appointment.	
12	§353	C- Expenses of academy; compensation for training.	
13	No tuition fee or any other charge shall be assessed against any		
14	department or agency for the training of any candidate and the		
15	expense of that training shall be borne by the department of		
16	public safety."		
17	SECT	ION 3. The director of public safety shall submit a	
18	report to the governor and legislature with its findings and		
19	recommendations relating to a plan for the state law enforcement		
20	training	academy not later than December 31, 2017.	

- 1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 4 establishment of the state law enforcement training academy.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 6 public safety for the purposes of this Act.

7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
