BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§103- Wages and hours of employees on leased public
5	lands. (a) Prior to the offering of a lease of public lands in
6	excess of \$5,000 per year, the lessor public agency shall
7	certify that:
8	(1) Services rendered on leased lands are performed by
9	employees paid at wages or salaries not less than the
10	wages paid to public employees for similar work; and
11	(2) The lessee complies with all federal and state laws
12	regarding workers' compensation, unemployment
13	compensation, hours, payment of wages, and safety
14	standards.
15	(b) No lease of public land in excess of \$5,000 per year
16	shall be granted unless all conditions of subsection (a) are
17	met. Failure to comply with this section may result in

- cancellation of the lease, unless the noncompliance is corrected 1
- within a reasonable period of time, as may be determined by the 2
- 3 department of labor and industrial relations.
- 4 The department of labor and industrial relations shall
- 5 adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 for the purposes of

- 7 (d) As used in this section, "public land" shall have the
- 8 same meaning as in section 171-2."
- 9 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 14 provided that it shall apply to all leases entered into after
- 15 January 1, 2017.
