A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Ship repair is a critical industry in our
- 2 maritime dependent state. Ship repair capability ensures the
- 3 safe and timely operation of ships and barges supplying the
- 4 Hawaiian Islands. Without this capability, many ships are
- 5 required to travel to the mainland for dry docking and repair
- 6 which in turn reduces revenues for the State. The ship repair
- 7 industry provides critical industrial services, including repair
- 8 of engines and generators, welding and metal fabrication,
- 9 ventilation and air conditioning, and critical servicing of oil
- 10 product transfer buoys and well-paying industrial and technical
- 11 job opportunities for the State. However, ship repair
- 12 companies in Hawaii have a significant cost competitive
- 13 disadvantage with mainland and foreign ship repair entities due
- 14 to higher labor and material shipping costs. Sustaining and
- 15 supporting a strong maritime repair industry is critical to the
- 16 quality of life and prosperity of the State of Hawaii.

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1	The Hawaii shipbuilding and repair industry is comprised of		
2	establishments that are primarily engaged in operating small		
3	shipyards, which are fixed facilities with dry docks and		
4	fabrication equipment. Shipyard activities include ship		
5	construction, repair, conversion and alteration, the production		
6	of prefabricated ships, boats, barge sections, and other		
7	specialized services. Hawaii's shipbuilding and repair industry		
8	utilizes local manufacturing and other trades outside of the		
9	shipyard, providing vital jobs that are economically beneficial		
10	to Hawaii.		
11	The purpose of this Act is to enhance maritime productivity		
12	and workforce development by establishing a maritime industry		
13	grant program.		
14	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by		
15	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read		
16	as follows:		
17	"CHAPTER		
18	MARITIME INDUSTRY GRANT PROGRAM		
19	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:		
20	"Department" means the department of labor and industrial		

relations.

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- 1 "Qualified shipyard" means a shipyard facility located in
- 2 Honolulu Harbor comprised of not more than one thousand two
- 3 hundred employees.
- 4 § -2 Maritime industry grant program established. There
- 5 is established within the department a maritime industry grant
- 6 program to be developed and administered by the department and
- 7 under which the department shall award grants to qualified
- 8 shipyards. The department shall accept applications for grants
- 9 on forms prescribed and prepared by the department.
- 10 § -3 Eligibility for grants. (a) The department shall
- 11 award grants for the maritime industry grant program based on
- 12 criteria that shall be developed by the department; provided
- 13 that no grant shall be awarded to a qualified shipyard that has
- 14 been in operation for less than five years.
- 15 (b) Projects eligible to receive grants from the maritime
- 16 industry grant program shall include:
- 17 (1) Capital improvement projects to foster efficiency,
- 18 competitive operations, and quality ship construction,
- 19 repair, and ship reconfiguration by qualified
- 20 shipyards; and

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- (2) Workforce development and training projects to improve
 employee skills in the maritime industry.
- 3 (c) Grants may also be awarded by the department for the
- 4 purchase of machinery and equipment; provided that the machinery
- 5 and equipment is used in ship repair, ship construction, or ship
- 6 reconfiguration.
- 7 (d) The grant shall not exceed \$ in any year and
- 8 only one grant shall be awarded to a qualified shipyard in any
- 9 given year.
- 10 (e) In reviewing grant applications submitted pursuant to
- 11 this chapter, the department shall analyze each application to
- 12 determine the economic viability of the grant request and the
- 13 benefits that will be realized by the State should the grant be
- 14 awarded. If the department determines through its analysis that
- 15 the grant request is not economically viable or will not be
- 16 beneficial to the State, the grant shall not be awarded.
- 17 § -4 Reports. The department shall submit a report to
- 18 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 19 of each regular session held in an even-numbered year. The
- 20 report shall include:
- 21 (1) The total number of grant applications received;

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1	(2) 1	The total number of grants awarded;
2	(3)	The projected economic and workforce development
3	k	penefits expected from the awarding of the grant;
4	(4)	The actual economic and workforce development benefits
5	1	realized from awarding of each grant;
6	(5)	The total amount of money awarded for each grant; and
7	(6) I	Any other information about the maritime industry
8	ģ	grant program the department deems necessary.
9	§ -5	Rules. The department shall adopt rules, pursuant
10	to chapter	91, to implement this chapter.
11	§ -6	Exemption from chapter 42F. The provisions of
12	chapter 421	F shall not apply to the grants made pursuant to this
13	chapter, bu	it all grants shall be made only in accordance with
14	standards a	and conditions specified in section -3."
15	SECTIO	ON 3. There is appropriated out of the general
16	revenues of	f the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
17	thereof as	may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
18	awarding o	f grants under the maritime industry grant program
19	establishe	d pursuant to this Act.
20	The s	um appropriated shall be expended by the department of

labor and industrial for the purposes of this Act.

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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
