A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that American Sign
- 2 Language is one of the most popular foreign languages at
- 3 institutions of higher education in the United States.
- 4 The legislature finds that recognition of American Sign
- 5 Language would provide many benefits to the State and its
- 6 people, including:
- 7 (1) Encouraging deaf children to become more self-
- 8 confident in their identity, gain language fluency at
- 9 an earlier age, and improve their critical-thinking
- skills; and
- 11 (2) Enriching the language development of hearing
- children.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to establish and designate
- 14 American Sign Language as a language distinct from English or
- 15 Hawaiian.

- 1 SECTION 2. Chapter 5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 "§5- Designation of language. American Sign Language is
- 5 established and designated as a language distinct from English
- 6 and Hawaiian."
- 7 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
