A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATED TO MAUNA KEA LANDS MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and

 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . MAUNA KEA LANDS
- 5 §171-A Definitions. As used in this subpart:
- 6 "Fees" includes rents on leases of Mauna Kea lands, moneys
- 7 received for use of Mauna Kea lands, moneys attributable to
- 8 commercial activities on Mauna Kea lands, and moneys received
- 9 for the use of facilities and programs on Mauna Kea lands.
- 10 "Mauna Kea lands" means the lands that the University of
- 11 Hawaii formerly leased from the board of land and natural
- 12 resources, including the Mauna Kea Science Reserve, Hale Pohaku,
- 13 the connecting roadway corridor between Hale Pohaku and the
- 14 Mauna Kea Science Reserve, and any other lands on Mauna Kea that
- 15 the University of Hawaii formerly leased or over which the
- 16 University of Hawaii formerly acquired control or jurisdiction.

- 1 §171-B Mauna Kea lands; fees; lease agreements. (a) The
- 2 board may charge a fee for use of the Mauna Kea lands and for
- 3 the use of facilities and programs related to the Mauna Kea
- 4 lands.
- 5 (b) The board may enter into lease agreements for the
- 6 Mauna Kea lands; provided that any lessee, including the
- 7 University of Hawaii, shall comply with all statutory
- 8 requirements in the disposition of ceded lands.
- 9 (c) In establishing the fees, the board shall be exempt
- 10 from the public notice, public hearing, and gubernatorial
- 11 approval requirements of chapter 91; provided that the fees
- 12 shall be established at an open public meeting pursuant to
- 13 chapter 92. The fees shall be deposited into the Mauna Kea
- 14 lands management special fund established under section 304A-F.
- 15 §171-C Mauna Kea lands rules. The board may adopt rules
- 16 pursuant to chapter 91 to regulate public and commercial
- 17 activities on Mauna Kea lands.
- In adopting these rules, the board shall:
- 19 (1) Strive for consistency with the administrative rules
- of the division of forestry and wildlife of the

1		department related to forest reserves and natural are
2		reserves;
3	(2)	Consult with the office of Hawaiian affairs to ensure
4		that these rules shall not affect any right,
5		customarily and traditionally exercised for
6		subsistence, cultural, and religious purposes and
7		possessed by ahupuaa tenants who are descendants of
8		native Hawaiians who inhabited the Hawaiian Islands
9		prior to 1778, subject to the right of the State to
10		regulate these rights; and
11	(3)	Hold at least one public hearing, in addition to the
12		public hearing at which decision making on the
13		proposed rule is made, on the island of Hawaii.
14	§171	-D Violations; penalties; costs; collection. (a) In
15	consultat	ion with the office of Hawaiian affairs, the board may
16	set and p	rovide for the assessment and collection of
17	administr	ative fines for violations of this subpart or rules
18	adopted h	ereunder; provided that the fines shall be set as
19	follows:	
20	(1)	For the first violation, not more than \$2.500:

- (3) For the third violation within five years of a prior violation and any subsequent violation, not more than \$10,000.
- 6 (b) Each day that the violation continues shall constitute7 a separate offense.
- 8 (c) The costs of any enforcement proceedings, including
 9 the costs of contested case proceedings, may be assessed against
 10 a party found to be in violation.
- (d) Any action taken to impose or collect the penaltyprovided for in this section shall be considered a civil action.
- 13 §171-E Mauna Kea lands; reporting requirements. The board
 14 shall report annually to the legislature, no later than twenty
 15 days prior to the convening of each regular session, on the
 16 Mauna Kea lands activities, current and pending lease agreements
 17 and fees, the status of current and pending administrative
 18 rules, income and expenditures of the Mauna Kea lands special

fund established in section 304A-F, and any other issues that

20 may impact the activities of the Mauna Kea lands.

- 3 (d) The department may establish separate accounts within
- 4 the special fund for major program activities.
- 5 (e) All expenditures from the special fund shall be

- 7 §171-G Office of Mauna Kea management; Mauna Kea
- 8 management commission; established. (a) There is established
- 9 the office of Mauna Kea management to be placed within the
- 10 department to assist the board in regulating public, scientific,
- 11 cultural, and commercial activities on Mauna Kea lands.
- 12 (b) There is established the Mauna Kea management
- 13 commission to be placed within the office of Mauna Kea
- 14 management that shall consist of seven members to be appointed
- 15 in the manner and to serve for the terms provided in section 26-
- 16 34; provided that:
- 17 (1) One member shall be a member of the Kahu Ku Mauna
- 18 advisory council;
- 19 (2) Two members shall be appointed by the governor from a
- list provided by the Kahu Ku Mauna advisory council;

1	(3)	ne member shall be a trustee or representative of th
2		ffice of Hawaiian affairs;

- 3 (4) One member shall be a county official appointed by the 4 governor from a list provided by the mayor of the 5 county of Hawaii;
- 6 (5) One member shall be the chairperson of the board of land and natural resources; and
- 8 (6) One member shall be appointed by the governor from a9 list provided by native Hawaiian organizations.
- 10 (b) The governor shall appoint the chairperson from among
 11 the members of the office.
- 12 (c) The members of the office shall serve without pay but
 13 shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses,
 14 including travel expenses, incurred in carrying out their
- 15 duties.
- (d) Any action taken by the office shall be approved by a simple majority of its members. Four members shall constitute a quorum to do business.
- (e) The office, without regard to the requirements ofchapter 76, may hire employees necessary to perform its duties."

6	request or allotment to the University of Hawaii unless the
7	University of Hawaii requests the reduction.
8	(d) The University of Hawaii may establish separate
9	accounts within the special fund for major program activities.
10	(e) All expenditures from the special fund shall be
11	subject to legislative appropriation.
12	(f) For the purposes of this section, "Mauna Kea lands"
13	shall mean the same as defined in section 304A-1901."]
14	SECTION 4. Within thirty days of the effect date of this
15	Act, University of Hawaii is directed to transfer the lease over
16	the Mauna Kea lands back to the board of land and natural
17	resources.
18	SECTION 5. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of
19	the University of Hawaii with regard to the management of the
20	Mauna Kea lands are transferred to the department of land and
21	natural resources.

All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose 1 functions are transferred to the department of land and natural 2 resources by this Act shall retain their civil service status, 3 4 whether permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred without loss of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by 5 6 applicable collective bargaining agreements), retention points, prior service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits 7 previously earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges, 8 9 in accordance with state personnel laws and this Act; provided that the employees possess the minimum qualifications and public 10 employment requirements for the class or position to which 11 transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that 12 13 subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and compensation laws. 14 Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil 15 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may 16 retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed **17** 18 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer 19 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits 20 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a 21

- 1 consequence of this Act; provided that the employees possess
- 2 legal and public employment requirements for the position to
- 3 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further
- 4 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to
- 5 applicable employment and compensation laws. The chairperson of
- 6 the board of land and natural resources may prescribe the duties
- 7 and qualifications of these employees and fix their salaries
- 8 without regard to chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 9 SECTION 6. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 10 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 11 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 12 acquired, or held by the University of Hawaii relating to the
- 13 functions transferred to the department of land and natural
- 14 resources shall be transferred with the functions to which they
- 15 relate.
- 16 SECTION 7. All rules, policies, procedures, guidelines,
- 17 and other material adopted or developed by the University of
- 18 Hawaii to implement provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes
- 19 which are reenacted or made applicable to the department of land
- 20 and natural resources by this Act, shall remain in full force
- 21 and effect until amended or repealed by the department of land



- 1 and natural resources pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised
- 2 Statutes. In the interim, every reference to the University of
- 3 Hawaii or the board of regents of the University of Hawaii in
- 4 those rules, policies, procedures, guidelines, and other
- 5 material is amended to refer to the department of land and
- 6 natural resources or board of land and natural resources, as
- 7 appropriate.
- 8 SECTION 8. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 9 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 10 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 11 the new sections in this Act.
- 12 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken.
- 14 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
