

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOURISM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Waikiki beach is a
- 2 key asset to the State's visitor industry. Preserving this
- 3 beach and maintaining public access along the beach are vital to
- 4 the strength of the industry. The long-overdue restoration of a
- 5 continuous beach along the Waikiki waterfront is a priority for
- 6 Hawaii's largest economic industry. Steps toward restoration
- 7 should start immediately, since the environmental reviews and
- 8 construction process will take time.
- 9 The legislature further finds that private interests will
- 10 provide funding for approximately twenty-five per cent of the
- 11 costs to restore and maintain Waikiki beach and associated
- 12 amenities. The State needs to do its part and provide funds to
- 13 ensure the area remains a world-class destination.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to promote tourism by
- 15 appropriating funds for the restoration of a continuous beach
- 16 and infrastructure for public access along the Waikiki
- 17 waterfront.

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- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,500,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 4 planning and design of a beach and associated infrastructure
- 5 between the Royal Hawaiian groin and the Fort DeRussy storm
- 6 drain groin, including a multi-use pedestrian and bicycle path
- 7. that allows public access throughout the length of the shoreline
- 8 connecting Kaimana beach with Ala Moana beach park.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
