A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Act 387, Session Laws of Hawaii 1988, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By amending section 1 to read:
- 4 "SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the economy of the
- 5 island of Molokai [is] remains at a critical juncture. [The
- 6 residents have long-relied on the pineapple industry as the
- 7 major provider of jobs; however, since I since the closure of
- 8 Dole Company's operations in 1976 and the reduction of Del
- 9 Monte's operations in 1983, hundreds of Molokai residents have
- 10 been jobless and the island's unemployment rate [at over
- 11 fourteen per cent] is more than twice the rate of any other
- 12 island and the highest in the State. The legislature further
- 13 finds that the revival of Molokai's economy is contingent on the
- 14 development and growth of small businesses, especially in
- 15 diversified agriculture, and that it is the public interest to
- 16 provide financial support to facilitate such development and
- 17 growth on Molokai. Further, the legislature finds that the
- 18 costs that farmers and ranchers must incur to comply with

- 1 federal and state requirements, including the food safety
- 2 requirements of the United States Food and Drug Administration
- 3 (FDA) Food Safety Modernization Act, are prohibitive to some
- 4 farmers and ranchers and will likely result in farm and ranch
- 5 closures on Molokai. These farmers and ranchers require
- 6 assistance with meeting these compliance costs to prevent such
- 7 closures and the detrimental effect they will have on the
- 8 diversified agricultural industry on Molokai. The purpose of
- 9 this Act is to establish a [revolving loan] cost reimbursement
- 10 program to stimulate business development and growth in
- 11 diversified agriculture on the Island of Molokai [-] and provide
- 12 cost reimbursement to farmers and ranchers on Molokai to cover
- 13 the costs, including audit costs and other expenses, of
- 14 complying with the FDA Food Safety Modernization Act and state
- 15 food safety laws."
- 2. By amending section 3 to read:
- 17 "SECTION 3. (a) The county of Maui shall establish a
- 18 temporary [revolving loan] cost reimbursement program to provide
- 19 [financing opportunities] for small business ventures that are
- 20 in diversified agriculture [on-Molokai.] and cost reimbursement
- 21 to farmers and ranchers on Molokai to help them meet the costs,

- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much

- 5 reimbursement applications made pursuant to Act 387, Session
- 6 Laws of Hawaii 1988, as amended by this Act.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of
- 8 Maui for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
