BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 448-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+]\$448-8.5[+] Continuing education requirements. The
- 4 board shall adopt a program of continuing education for dentists
- 5 and a program of continuing education for dental hygienists.
- 6 After January 1, 2002, at the time of reregistration of license
- 7 as a dentist or dental hygienist, each licensee shall present to
- 8 the board evidence of compliance with the program of continuing
- 9 education applicable to their profession. After January 1,
- 10 2016, at the time of reregistration of license as a dentist,
- 11 each licensee shall present to the board evidence of having
- 12 obtained at least three hours of ethics training in the two-year
- 13 <u>license period immediately preceding the registration</u>
- 14 application. Failure to reregister and present evidence of
- 15 compliance shall constitute a forfeiture of license, which may
- 16 be restored only upon written application therefor and payment
- 17 to the board of a restoration fee."

5	in the employment of the department of health, a federally				
6	qualified health center, Native Hawaiian health systems center,				
7	or post-secondary dental auxiliary training program accredited				
8	by the American Dental Association Commission on Dental				
9	Accreditation. Community service licensees under this section				
10	shall abide by the requirements and conditions placed upon those				
11	fully licensed under this chapter.				
12	Eligible candidates shall:				
13	(1) Provide copies of documentation and credentials that				
14	include but are not limited to:				
15	(A) A diploma or certificate of graduation from a				
16	dental college accredited by the American Dental				
17	Association Commission on Dental Accreditation,				
18	recognized and approved by the board; and				
19	(B) Either of the following:				
20	(i) A certificate or other evidence satisfactory

13	(4)	Pay applicable registration fees, which shall be one
14		half of the prevailing biennial registration fee for
15		dentistry[+]; and
16	(5)	Present evidence of having obtained at least three
17		hours of ethics training.
18	No person	who after July 2, 2004, has failed to pass the license
19	examination	on administered under this chapter shall have the
20	benefit o	f a community service dental license."
