A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL CLOSURES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the recent sudden
- 2 closure of Corinthian Colleges, Inc. and specifically Heald
- 3 College in April 2015, left thousands of adult students at its
- 4 Honolulu campus unsupported and helpless. Current law already
- 5 requires that accredited post-secondary institutions under the
- 6 Hawaii post-secondary education authorization program be secured
- 7 by a surety bond to ensure that students are fully or at least
- 8 partially compensated in the event of a school closure.
- 9 Subsequent to the Heald College closure, the post-secondary
- 10 education authorization program established a school closure
- 11 policy and procedure to better protect students in the future.
- 12 The legislature finds, however, that there is no such protection
- 13 for students of unaccredited post-secondary institutions in the
- 14 State, and at a minimum, unaccredited institutions should also
- 15 be subject to bonding requirements.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to protect students of
- 17 unaccredited post-secondary institutions from school closures,

- 1 by requiring unaccredited institutions to post a bond along with
- 2 their application for registration with the department of
- 3 commerce and consumer affairs.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 446E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "\$446E-5 Prohibited practices. (a) No unaccredited
- 7 institution shall indicate or suggest that the State licenses,
- 8 approves, or regulates its operations. Acceptance by the
- 9 director of any documents from an unaccredited institution shall
- 10 not be construed as evidence that the director has determined
- 11 the adequacy of any filing.
- 12 (b) Any institution that is not accredited by the American
- 13 Bar Association shall not issue a juris doctor degree (J.D.), a
- 14 master of laws degree (LL.M.), or any equivalent or comparable
- degree.
- 16 (c) Any institution that is not accredited by the Liaison
- 17 Committee on Medical Education shall not issue a doctor of
- 18 medicine degree (M.D.), or any equivalent or comparable degree.
- 19 (d) No unaccredited institution shall issue degrees unless
- 20 the institution has an office located in Hawaii, at least one
- 21 employee who resides in Hawaii, and at least twenty-five

1	enrolled students in Hawaii, in each academic year of its
2	operation for the purpose of performing course requirements that
3	are part of the students' educational curriculum.
4	(e) No unaccredited institution that operates in or from
5	the State or has a presence in this State shall accept or
6	receive any tuition payment or other fee from or on behalf of a
7	student unless the institution complies with all of the
8	requirements of this chapter.
9	(f) No unaccredited institution shall disclose in any
10	catalog, promotional material or written contract for
11	instruction that it has applied for future accreditation.
12	(g) No unaccredited institution shall operate in this
13	state without first posting a bond along with its application
14	for a certificate of registration by an individual executed by a
15	corporate surety qualified to do business in this state and
16	conditioned upon compliance with this chapter. The total
17	aggregate liability on the bond shall be limited to
18	\$, or so much thereof as may be determined.
19	(h) No unaccredited institution shall operate in this
20	state without first posting a bond along with its application
21	for a certificate of registration by a partnership or

corporation shall be accompanied by a bond executed by a

corporate surety qualified to do business in this state and

conditioned upon compliance with this chapter in the amount of

, or so much as to be determined based on

the total number of projected students."

SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
