A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMAL DISSECTION IN SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that moral, ethical, or
- 2 religious principles regarding the humane treatment of animals
- 3 make some students unwilling to participate in dissecting or
- 4 harming animals. Students who are forced to participate in such
- 5 actions may abandon the study of science altogether if not
- 6 provided an alternative.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to respect student beliefs,
- 8 increase student learning, and lower educational costs by:
- 9 (1) Allowing students to decline to participate in animal dissections; and
- 12 Require schools to make alternatives available to

 12 students who have declined to participate in an animal

 13 dissection.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:

1	"§302- Dissection of animals; opportunity to decline.
2	(a) Any student may decline to participate in the dissection of
3	any animal, including participating in or observing:
4	(1) The dissection, vivisection, incubation, infliction of
5	harm, or capture of any animal;
6	(2) Surgery, an invasive procedure, or the experimentation
7	on an animal; or
8	(3) The termination of any animal's life.
9	(b) Any student who declines to participate in the
10	dissection of an animal shall be provided with a suitable
11	alternative education project designed to provide the student
12	with the equivalent factual knowledge, information, or
13	experience. Any alternative education project shall not require
14	more time or effort than the dissection. A comparable grading
15	method shall assess the alternative project.
16	(c) If a test or examination requires the dissection of ar
17	animal or the use of a dissected animal, any student who has
18	declined to participate in the dissection of an animal shall be
19	provided with an alternative test or examination that does not
20	use an animal specimen.

1	(d) No student shall be penalized or discriminated against
2	for declining to participate in the dissection of any animal;
3	provided that the student fulfills the requirements of the
4	assigned alternative education project or test or examination.
5	(e) Each school shall notify its students and their
6	parents in writing of the option to decline to participate in
7	the dissection of any animal:
8	(1) At the beginning of each semester; and
9	(2) Not less than three weeks prior to any scheduled
10	dissection;
11	provided that any student may decline to participate in the
12	dissection of an animal on the day of the dissection.
13	(f) As used in this section:
14	"Animal" means any living organism, including, but not
15	limited to, frogs, cats, fetal pigs, and earthworms, including
16	an animal's cadaver or severed parts thereof.
17	"Alternative education project" means the use of video
18	equipment, models, films, books, photos, pictures, computers,
19	live observation in the wild or in zoos, or any other tools
20	which provide an alternative method to the use of live or once

- 1 live animals for obtaining and testing knowledge, information,
- 2 or experience."
- 3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
