A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE WAIANAE COAST.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that one of the purposes
 of Act 6, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, was to authorize
 a baseline environmental study of the Waianae coast ocean area.
 In February 2009, the Waianae baseline environmental study was
 prepared for the department of land and natural resources
 division of boating and ocean recreation.

7 The study noted that the division of boating and ocean 8 recreation was unable to regulate commercial tour operators 9 launching from private harbors. To address this issue, the 10 legislature authorized the department of land and natural 11 resources to regulate commercial enterprises that operate out of 12 private marinas and use state waters or marine resources in Act 13 289, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012.

14 Trying to replicate such success, the purpose of this Act 15 is to authorize an update of the Waianae baseline environmental 16 study and to complete the additional studies and monitoring 17 recommended in the 2009 study.



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1	SECTION 2. The department of land and natural resources		
2	shall prepare an update to the 2009 Waianae baseline		
3	environmental study. The update shall include the following:		
4	(1)	Any and all updates but at a minimum an update on the	
5		ocean uses off the Waianae coast;	
6	(2)	A review, assessment, and evaluation of the Hawaiian	
7		islands dolphin SMART program;	
8	(3)	The results of research studies and monitoring of the	
9		impacts of ocean use activities on marine mammals,	
10		especially spinner dolphins and the endangered	
11		Hawaiian monk seal, along the Waianae coast to	
12		estimate disturbance levels and the number of	
13		commercial tour operators that would minimize	
14		disturbance to the spinner dolphin, endangered	
15		Hawaiian monk seal, and other marine mammals;	
16	(4)	Rigorous analyses of long-term catch data to better	
17	•	characterize akule and 'opelu fisheries, specifically	
18		using smaller reporting grids to decipher changes in	
19		the fisheries and fishery-independent studies to	
20		evaluate the status of the fisheries;	



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1	(5)	A review of commercial ocean recreational activities	
2		conducted from county beach parks;	
3	(6)	A review of land-based commercial ocean recreational	
4		activities, such as surf schools, kayaking tours,	
5		snorkeling, and kayaking or stand up paddle board	
6		equipment rental conducted along the Waianae coast and	
7		the impact on public recreational use;	
8	(7)	An assessment of thrill craft use along the Waianae	
9		coast; and	
10	(8)	A discussion of the incorporation of place-based,	
11		culture-based, and community-based strategies and	
12		activities as an integral part of the Waianae	
13		sustainable communities initiative.	
14	The	division of aquatic resources shall provide the	
15	department of land and natural resources with the technical		
16	assistance and information necessary to help prepare the update.		
17	SECTION 3. For purposes of this Act, "ocean use		
18	activities" means commercial operation of thrill craft, high-		
19	speed boating, parasailing, water sledding, sailing and		
20	snorkeling tours, glassbottom boat tours, dolphin tours, or any		



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other similar commercial activity as defined in section 200 4(a)(9), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

3 SECTION 4. The department of land and natural resources
4 shall submit the update to the Waianae baseline environmental
5 study to the legislature not later than twenty days prior to the
6 convening of the regular session of 2018.

7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
