### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EVIDENCE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 621, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§621- Limitation on compellable testimony from
5	journalists and newscasters; exceptions. (a) A journalist or
6	newscaster presently or previously employed by or otherwise
7	professionally associated with any newspaper or magazine or any
8	digital version thereof operated by the same organization, news
9	agency, press association, wire service, or radio or television
10	transmission station or network, shall not be required by a
11	legislative, executive, or judicial officer or body, or any
12	other authority having the power to compel testimony or the
13	production of evidence, to disclose, by subpoena or otherwise:
14	(1) The source, or information that could reasonably be
15	expected to lead to the discovery of the identity of
16	the source, of any published or unpublished
17	information obtained by the person while so employed

1		or professionally associated in the course of
2		gathering, receiving, or processing information for
3		communication to the public; or
4	(2)	Any unpublished information obtained or prepared by
5		the person while so employed or professionally
6		associated in the course of gathering, receiving, or
7		processing information for communication to the
8		public.
9	(b)	The limitation on compellable testimony established by
10	this sect	ion may also be claimed by and afforded to any
11	individua	l who can demonstrate by clear and convincing evidence
12	that:	
13	(1)	The individual has regularly and materially
14		participated in the reporting or publishing of news or
15		information of substantial public interest for the
16		purpose of dissemination to the general public by
17		means of tangible or electronic media;
18	(2)	The position of the individual is materially similar
19		or identical to that of a journalist or newscaster,

1	(3)	The interest of the individual in protecting the
2		sources and unpublished information under subsection
3		(a) is materially similar to the interest of the
4		individuals referenced under subsection (a); and
5	(4)	The public interest is served by affording the
6		protections of this section in a specific circumstance
7		under consideration.
8	<u>(c)</u>	This section shall not apply if:
9	(1)	Probable cause exists to believe that the person
10		claiming the privilege has committed, is committing,
11		or is about to commit a crime;
12	(2)	The person claiming the privilege has observed the
13		alleged commission of a crime, but if:
14		(A) The interest in maintaining the privilege granted
15		by this section outweighs the public interest in
16		disclosure; and
17		(B) The commission of the crime is the act of
18		communicating or providing the information or
19		documents at issue,
20		then the privilege granted by this section may be
21		asserted;

1	(3)	There is substantial evidence that the source or
2		information sought to be disclosed is material to the
3		investigation, prosecution, or defense of a felony, or
<b>4</b> .		to a civil action for defamation, and the source or
5		information sought is:
6		(A) Unavailable, despite exhaustion of reasonable
7		alternative sources;
8		(B) Noncumulative; and
9		(C) Necessary and relevant to the charge, claim, or
10		<pre>defense asserted;</pre>
11	(4)	The information sought to be disclosed is critical to
12		prevent serious harm to life or public safety; or
13	(5)	The source consents to the disclosure of unpublished
14		documents or other tangible materials provided by the
15		source.
16	(d)	No fine or imprisonment shall be imposed against a
17	person cl	aiming the privilege pursuant to this section for
18	refusal t	o disclose information privileged pursuant to this
19	section."

### Report Title:

Journalists and Newscasters; Disclosure

#### Description:

Limits compelled disclosure of sources or unpublished information by journalists, newscasters and persons participating in collection or dissemination of news or information of substantial public interest. Establishes exceptions.

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
