A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CYCLE TRACKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to define cycle
- 2 tracks, clarify the use of cycle tracks, and prohibit the use of
- 3 mopeds on bicycle lanes, cycle tracks, and bicycle paths.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 264-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by amending subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d) to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 "(a) Out of the state highway fund amounts, whether state
- 8 funds or federal funds, shall be expended as necessary by the
- 9 State for the establishment of bikeways; provided that bikeways
- 10 shall be established, whenever practicable, wherever a new or
- 11 existing highway, road, or street is being designed, planned,
- 12 constructed, reconstructed, relocated, or rehabilitated. At
- 13 least two per cent of eligible federal funds, and in addition,
- 14 other state highway fund moneys as available, shall be expended
- 15 to:
- 16 (1) Establish multi-use paths, bicycle paths, cycle
- 17 <u>tracks</u>, and bicycle lanes; and

1	(2) Install signage and safety devices along bikeways;
2	provided that the department of transportation shall include th
3	bicycling community in a public involvement process to determin
4	the location of multi-use paths, bicycle paths, cycle tracks,
5	bicycle lanes, and installation of signage and safety devices
6	along bikeways.
7	Planning for any mass transit system shall include
8	appropriate accommodation for bicycle lanes, bikeways, and
9	bicycle routes, including bicycle racks on mass transit
10	vehicles, to enable mass transit users to connect conveniently
11	by bicycle to transit stations and bus stops.
12	This subsection shall not be construed as requiring the
13	expenditure of a county surcharge on state tax under section
14	46-16.8, on bicycle paths if the application of this subsection
15	conflicts with section 46-16.8.
16	(b) Bikeways are not required to be established under
17	subsection (a):
18	(1) Where the establishment of the lanes, paths, routes,
19	[and] ways, and cycle tracks would be contrary to
20	public safety; or

_	(2) If the cost of establishing the lanes, paths, routes,
. 2	[and] ways, and cycle tracks would be excessively
3	disproportionate to the need or probable use; or
4	(3) Where low population density, other available ways, or
5	other factors indicate an absence of any need for the
6	lanes, paths, routes, [and] ways[+], and cycle tracks;
7	provided that the department of transportation shall involve
. 8	representatives of the bicycling community, such as the Hawaii
9	Bicycling League, Kauai PATH, Maui Bicycling Alliance, PATH (Big
10	Island), and others in making a determination under paragraphs
11	(1), (2), and (3); provided further that any decision under this
12	subsection shall be documented, including but not limited to,
13	the factors considered in making a decision; and provided
14	further that the department of transportation shall have the
15	burden of persuasion under paragraphs (2) and (3).
16	(c) The department of transportation, when requested,
17	shall provide technical assistance and advice to counties in
18	carrying out the purpose of this section. The department of
19	transportation shall recommend construction standards for
20	bikeways. The department of transportation, in the manner
21	prescribed for marking highways under section 264-25, shall

- 1 provide a uniform system of marking and signing such lanes,
- 2 paths, routes, and ways which shall apply to lanes, paths,
- 3 routes, [and] ways, and cycle tracks under the jurisdiction of
- 4 the department of transportation and the counties.
- 5 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the department of
- 6 transportation and the counties may restrict the use of the
- 7 lanes, paths, routes, [and] ways, and cycle tracks to
- 8 pedestrians and non-motorized vehicles.
- 9 (d) As used in this section, the terms "bikeway", "bicycle
- 10 path", [and] "bicycle lane", and "cycle track" shall have the
- 11 same meaning as in section 291C-1."
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 291-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by amending the definition of "public street, road, or
- 14 highway" to read as follows:
- 15 ""Public street, road, or highway" includes the entire
- 16 width, including berm or shoulder, of every road, alley, street,
- 17 way, lane, trail, highway, bikeway, bridge, when any part
- 18 thereof is open for use by the public, including any bicycle
- 19 lane, bicycle path, cycle track, bikeway, controlled-access
- 20 highway, laned roadway, roadway, or street, as defined in

- 1 section 291C-1, and any public highway, as defined in section
- **2** 264-1."
- 3 SECTION 4. Section 291C-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended as follows:
- 5 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 6 and to read:
- 7 "Cycle track" means that portion of any highway set aside
- 8 for the exclusive use of bicycles and physically separated from
- 9 motor vehicles. Cycle tracks may be designated as one-way or
- 10 two-way."
- 11 2. By amending the definition of "bikeway" to read:
- ""Bikeway" means a bicycle lane, cycle track, bicycle path,
- 13 or bicycle route[, or any traffic control device, shelter,
- 14 parking facility, or other support facility to serve bicycles
- 15 and persons using bicycles]."
- 16 SECTION 5. Section 291C-64, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 "§291C-64 Vehicle entering highway from private road or
- 19 driveway. The driver of a vehicle about to enter or cross a
- 20 highway (including bicycle lane, cycle track, or bicycle path)
- 21 from an alley, building, private road, or driveway or from any

- 1 public or private property other than a highway that is adjacent
- 2 to the highway, shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles or
- 3 bicycles approaching on the highway (including bicycle lane,
- 4 cycle track, or bicycle path) to be entered."
- 5 SECTION 6. Section 291C-76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- $oldsymbol{6}$ amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 7 "(a) Where sidewalks are provided, it shall be unlawful
- 8 for any pedestrian to walk along and upon an adjacent roadway,
- 9 bicycle lane, cycle track, or bicycle path[-], except for the
- 10 purpose of crossing a bikeway.".
- 11 SECTION 7. Section 291C-94, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 "S291C-94 Emerging from alley, driveway, or building. The
- 14 driver of a vehicle emerging from an alley, building, private
- 15 road, or driveway or from any public or private property other
- 16 than a highway that is adjacent to a bicycle lane, cycle track,
- 17 bicycle path, sidewalk, or sidewalk area shall stop the vehicle
- 18 immediately prior to driving onto the bicycle lane, cycle track,
- 19 bicycle path, sidewalk, or sidewalk area extending across the
- 20 alley, building entrance, road, or driveway, or [such] the
- 21 public or private property, or in the event there is no bikeway

- $1\,$ or sidewalk area, shall stop at the point nearest the street to
- 2 be entered where the driver has a view of approaching traffic
- 3 thereon."
- 4 SECTION 8. Section 291C-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "\$291C-101 Basic rule. No person shall drive a vehicle at
- 7 a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent and having regard
- 8 to the actual and potential hazards and conditions then
- 9 existing. Consistent with the foregoing, every person shall
- 10 drive at a safe and appropriate speed when approaching and
- 11 crossing an intersection or railroad grade crossing, when
- 12 approaching and going around a curve, when approaching a hill
- 13 crest, when traveling upon any narrow or winding roadway, when
- 14 crossing a bikeway, and when special hazards exist with respect
- 15 to pedestrians or other traffic, or by reason of weather or
- 16 highway conditions."
- 17 SECTION 9. Section 291C-123, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 19 "(a) No person shall drive any vehicle other than a
- 20 bicycle [or moped] upon a bicycle lane, cycle track, or bicycle
- 21 path, except upon a permanent or authorized temporary driveway[7

or]. No person shall park any vehicle upon a bicycle lane, 2 cycle track, or bicycle path; provided that any vehicle may be driven or parked in a bicycle lane, cycle track, or bicycle path 3 as applicable if: It is in the process of executing a legal turn, lane 5 (1) 6 change, or parking maneuver; 7 (2) It is an authorized emergency vehicle performing the 8 functions under section 291C-26; 9 It is an official federal, state, or county vehicle in (3) 10 the performance of its actual duty; 11 (4) It is a stalled or broken vehicle; 12 It is necessary to assist a stalled or broken vehicle; (5) 13 (6) It is necessary to yield to an authorized emergency 14 vehicle pursuant to section 291C-65; or It is otherwise provided by law." 15 16 SECTION 10. Section 291C-141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: These regulations applicable to bicycles shall apply 18 19 whenever a bicycle is operated upon any highway or upon any [bicycle path] bikeway set aside for the preferential or 20

1	exclusive use of bicycles subject to those exceptions stated
2	herein."
3	SECTION 11. Section 291C-145, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended as follows:
5	1. By amending subsections (a) through (e) to read:
6	"(a) Every person operating a bicycle upon a roadway at a
7	speed less than the normal speed of traffic moving in the same
8	direction at [such] the time shall ride as near to the right-
9	hand curb, on the edge of the roadway, or on the shoulder off of
.0	the roadway as practicable, exercising due care when passing a
.1	standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction; except
.2	under any of the following situations:
.3	(1) When preparing for a left turn at an intersection or
4	into a private road or driveway, except where
.5	prohibited by official traffic-control devices;
.6	(2) When reasonably necessary to avoid conditions
.7	(including but not limited to fixed or moving objects,
.8	vehicles, bicycles, pedestrians, animals, surface
9	hazards, or substandard width lanes) that make it
0	unsafe to continue along the right-hand curb, on the
1	edge of the roadway, or on the shoulder off of the

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For purposes of this section, a "substandard

2		width lane" $is_{\gamma}a$ lane that is too narrow for a bicycle					
3		and a vehicle to travel safely side-by-side within the

5	(3)	When a roadway is designated and signposted to carry					
6		traffic in one direction only and has two or more					
7		marked traffic lanes, a person operating a bicycle may					
8		ride as near to the left-hand curb, on the edge of the					
9		roadway, or on the shoulder off of [such] the roadway					
10		as practicable[-]; or					
11	(4)	When riding in a two-way cycle track.					
12	(b)	Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway shall ride in					
13	single fi	le; provided that where the flow of traffic is					
14	unimpeded, riding two abreast upon bicycle lanes [and], bicycle						
15	paths, and cycle tracks shall be permitted when such lane or						
16	path is of sufficient width to allow riding two abreast unless						
17	otherwise prohibited by rule or ordinance adopted by the						
18	director	of transportation or by the counties.					
19	(c)	Whenever a usable bicycle lane or cycle track has been					
20	provided	on a highway, any person operating a bicycle at a speed					

less than the normal speed of traffic [moving in the same

- 4 (1) When overtaking and passing another bicycle, vehicle,
 5 or pedestrian within the lane or cycle track or about
 6 to enter the lane or cycle track if such overtaking
 7 and passing cannot be done safely within the lane[+]
 8 or cycle track;
- 9 (2) When preparing for a [left] turn at an intersection or 10 into a private road or driveway; or
- 11 (3) When reasonably necessary to leave the bicycle lane or

 12 cycle track to avoid debris or other hazardous

 13 conditions.
- (d) No person operating a bicycle shall leave a bicycle

 15 lane or cycle track until the movement can be made with

 16 reasonable safety and then only after giving an appropriate

 17 signal in the event that any vehicle may be affected by the

 18 movement.
- 19 (e) No person shall operate or ride a bicycle within a
 20 bicycle lane in any direction except that permitted of vehicular
 21 traffic traveling on the same side of the highway[-], unless

- 1 operating in a two-way cycle track. Upon all cycle tracks and
- 2 bicycle paths of sufficient width and providing for two-way
- 3 movement of bicycle traffic, bicycles proceeding in opposite
- 4 directions shall pass each other to the right."
- 5 2. By amending subsection (g) to read:
- 6 "(g) No person shall ride a bicycle equipped with a motor
- 7 on any sidewalk. The counties may, by ordinance, post signs on
- 8 bicycle lanes, cycle tracks, and bicycle paths to prevent
- 9 persons riding a bicycle equipped with a motor from using them."
- 10 SECTION 12. Section 291C-196, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) Every person driving a moped, except a three-wheeled
- 13 moped, upon a roadway at a speed less than the normal speed of
- 14 traffic moving in the same direction at [such] the time shall
- 15 ride as near to the right side of the roadway as practicable,
- 16 without entering into a bicycle lane, cycle track, or bicycle
- 17 path, exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle or one
- 18 proceeding in the same direction, except under any of the
- 19 following situations:

1	(1)	When preparing for a left turn at an intersection or
2	,	into a private road or driveway, except where
3		prohibited by official traffic-control devices;
4	(2)	When reasonably necessary to avoid conditions
5		(including, but not limited to fixed or moving
6	· ·	objects, vehicles, bicycles, pedestrians, animals,
7		surface hazards, or substandard width lanes) that make
8		it unsafe to continue along the right-hand curb or
9		edge; and
10	(3)	When a roadway is designated and signposted to carry
11		traffic in one direction only and has two or more
12		marked traffic lanes, a person operating a moped may
13		ride as near to the left-hand side of the roadway as
14		practicable."
15	SECT	ION 13. Section 291C-197, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended to	o read as follows:
17	"§29:	1C-197 Driving mopeds on bicycle lanes, cycle tracks,
18	and bicyc	le paths. (a) [Wherever bicycle lanes are provided on
19	the roadwa	y, moped drivers shall use such bicycle lanes.] Unless
20	authorized	d by rule or ordinance pursuant to subsection (b), no

- 1 person shall drive a moped on any bicycle lane, cycle track, or
- 2 bicycle path.
- 3 (b) The director of transportation by rule and the
- 4 counties by ordinance may with respect to bicycle paths under
- 5 their respective jurisdictions restrict or prohibit the use of
- 6 [such] bicycle paths by mopeds. Signs clearly visible to an
- 7 ordinarily observant person indicating the restriction or
- 8 prohibition shall be placed along bicycle paths so designated
- 9 and every moped driver shall obey the directions thereof.
- 10 [(c) This section shall not apply to a three wheeled
- 11 moped.]"
- 12 SECTION 14. This Act does not affect rights and duties
- 13 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
- 14 were begun before its effective date.
- 15 SECTION 15. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 16. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Bicycle; Cycle Tracks

Description:

Defines the term "cycle track" and clarifies the uses of a cycle track. Prohibits mopeds from using bicycle lanes, cycle tracks, and bicycle paths.

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
