A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CROSSWALK SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that confusion exists as
- 2 to when a vehicle must yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian
- 3 who plans to cross or is crossing a roadway, particularly with
- 4 regard to when a pedestrian is considered to be within an
- 5 intersection or adjacent crosswalk.
- 6 The legislature also finds that section 291C-33, Hawaii
- 7 Revised Statutes, relating to pedestrian-control signals, was
- 8 last amended in 1981. This section needs to be updated to
- 9 .include countdown timers and to clarify when a pedestrian is
- 10 allowed to cross when the countdown timer is operating.
- 11 Countdown timers show pedestrians how many seconds are left to
- 12 cross the street before the pedestrian signal changes from a
- 13 flashing "Don't Walk" to a steady "Don't Walk" or upraised palm
- 14 indication.
- The purpose of this measure is to clarify:
- 16 (1) The requirement that a driver of a motor vehicle yield
- to a pedestrian by specifying when a pedestrian is

1	considered to be within an intersection or adjacent		
2	crosswalk; and		
3	(2) When pedestrians may enter a crosswalk equipped with a		
4	countdown timer.		
5	SECTION 2. Section 291C-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
6	amended to read as follows:		
7	"§291C-32 Traffic-control signal legend. (a) Whenever		
8	traffic is controlled by traffic-control signals exhibiting		
9	different colored lights, or colored lighted arrows,		
10	successively one at a time or in combination, only the colors		
11	green, red, and yellow shall be used, except for special		
12	pedestrian signals carrying a word or symbol legend, and the		
13	lights shall indicate and apply to drivers of vehicles and		
14	pedestrians as follows:		
15	(1) Green indication:		
16	(A) Vehicular traffic facing a circular green signal		
17	may proceed straight through or turn right or		
18	left unless a sign at the place prohibits either		
19	such turn. But vehicular traffic, including		
20	vehicles turning right or left, shall yield the		
21	right-of-way to other vehicles and to pedestrians		

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1			lawrully within the intersection or an adjacent
2		·	crosswalk at the time such signal is exhibited.
3		(B)	Vehicular traffic facing a green arrow signal,
4			shown alone or in combination with another
5			indication, may cautiously enter the intersection
6			only to make the movement indicated by such
7			arrow, or such other movement as is permitted by
8			other indications shown at the same time. Such
9			vehicular traffic shall yield the right-of-way to
10			pedestrians lawfully within an adjacent crosswalk
11			and to other traffic lawfully using the
12			intersection.
13		(C)	Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian-control
14			signal, as provided in section 291C-33,
15			pedestrians facing any green signal, except when
16			the sole green signal is a turn arrow, may
17			proceed across the roadway within any marked or
18			unmarked crosswalk.
19	(2)	Stea	dy yellow indication:
20		(A)	Vehicular traffic facing a steady yellow signal
21			is thereby warned that the related green movement

1			is being terminated or that a red indication will
2			be exhibited immediately thereafter when
3			vehicular traffic shall not enter the
4			intersection.
5		(B)	Pedestrians facing a steady yellow signal, unless
6		•	otherwise directed by a pedestrian-control signal
7			as provided in section 291C-33, are thereby
8			advised that there is insufficient time to cross
9			the roadway before a red indication is shown and
10			no pedestrian shall then start to cross the
11			roadway.
12	(3)	Stea	dy red indication:
13		(A)	Vehicular traffic facing a steady red signal
14			alone shall stop at a clearly marked stop line,
15			but if none, before entering the crosswalk on the
16	,		near side of the intersection or, if none, then
17			before entering the intersection and shall remain
18			standing until an indication to proceed is shown,
19			except as provided in the next succeeding

paragraphs.

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1	(B)	The driver of a vehicle which is stopped in
2		obedience to a steady red indication may make a
3		right turn but shall yield the right-of-way to
4		pedestrians and other traffic proceeding as
5		directed by the signal at said intersection,
6		except that counties by ordinance may prohibit
7		any such right turn against a steady red
8		indication, which ordinance shall be effective
9	·	when a sign is erected at such intersection
10		giving notice thereof.
11	(C)	The driver of a vehicle on a one-way street which
12		intersects another one-way street on which
13		traffic moves to the left shall stop in obedience
14		to a steady red indication but may then make a
15		left turn into said one-way street, but shall
16		yield right-of-way to pedestrians, proceeding as
17		directed by the signal at said intersection
18		except that counties by ordinance may prohibit

any such left turn as above described which

ordinance shall be effective when a sign is

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1		erected at such intersection giving notice
2		chereof.
3	(D) T	Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian-control
4	,	signal as provided in section 291C-33,
5	1	pedestrians facing a steady red signal alone
6	:	shall not enter the roadway.
7	(b) In the	e event an official traffic-control signal is
8	erected and main	ntained at a place other than an intersection,
9	the provisions	of this section shall be applicable except as to
10	those provisions	s which by their nature can have no application.
11	Any stop require	ed shall be made at a sign or marking on the
12	pavement indica	ting where the stop shall be made, but in the
13	absence of any	such sign or marking the stop shall be made at
14	the signal.	,
15	(c) As us	ed in this section, a pedestrian is lawfully
16	within an inter	section or adjacent crosswalk when any part or
17	extension of the	e pedestrian, including any part of the
. 18	pedestrian's bo	dy, wheelchair, cane crutch, or bicycle, is
19	beyond the curb	or the edges of the traversable roadway or moves
20	onto the roadwa	y within an intersection or crosswalk."

T	SECT	ION 3. Section 2910-33, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to	o read as follows:
3	"§29	1C-33 Pedestrian-control signals. Whenever special
4	pedestria	n-control signals, exhibiting the [words] word "Walk"
5	or the sy	mbol of a walking person; the words "Don't Walk" or the
6	[symbols]	symbol of [a walking person or] an upraised palm; or a
7	countdown	timer are in place [such], these signals shall
8	indicate	as follows:
9	(1)	Walk or Walking Person. Pedestrians facing [such] the
10		signal may proceed across the roadway in the direction
11	•	of the signal and shall be given the right-of-way by
12		the drivers of all vehicles [-] :
13	(2)	Don't Walk or Upraised Palm. No pedestrian shall
14	•	start to cross the roadway in the direction of [such]
15		the signal, whether flashing or steady, but any
16		pedestrian who has partially completed the
17		pedestrian's crossing on the Walk or Walking Person
18		signal shall complete the crossing to a sidewalk or
19		safety island while the Don't Walk or Upraised Palm
20		signal is showing [-]; and

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1	(3) Countdown timer. If the pedestrian-control signal is
2	equipped with a countdown timer, no pedestrian shall
3	start to cross the roadway in the direction of the
4	signal when the countdown timer begins operating, but
5	any pedestrian who has partially completed the
6	pedestrian's crossing when the countdown timer begins
7	operating shall complete the crossing to a sidewalk or
8	safety island while the countdown timer is operating.
9	SECTION 4. Section 291C-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
11	"(a). The driver of a vehicle shall stop for a pedestrian
12	who is crossing the roadway within a crosswalk when the
13	pedestrian is either:
14	(1) Upon the half of the roadway upon which the vehicle is
15	traveling; or
16	(2) Approaching the vehicle so closely from the opposite
17	half of the roadway as to be in danger,
18	and shall not proceed until the pedestrian has passed the
19	vehicle and the driver can safely proceed.
20	As used in this section, a pedestrian is crossing the
21	roadway within a crosswalk when any part or extension of the

- 1 pedestrian, including any part of the pedestrian's body,
- 2 wheelchair, cane, crutch, or bicycle, is beyond the curb or the
- 3 edges of the traversable roadway within a crosswalk with the
- 4 intent to proceed."
- 5 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
