#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRIMARY ELECTIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
  by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
  as follows:

  "PART . ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE
- 5 "\$12- Eligibility to vote in primary elections. (a)
- 6 Except as provided in subsection (b), a voter who is registered
- 7 with a political party shall be allowed to vote only in the
- 8 primary election of the political party with which the voter is
- 9 registered.
- (b) A political party, no later than one hundred eighty
- 11 days prior to a primary election, may notify the chief election
- 12 officer in writing that, in addition to the voters who have
- 13 registered with the party, the party elects to allow any of the
- 14 following to vote in the party's primary election:
- 15 (1) Unaffiliated voters; and
- 16 (2) Voters registered with a different political party;
- 17 provided that a state chairman of a political party

1	that elects to allow voters to vote in that party's
2	primary election pursuant to this paragraph shall
3	identify to the chief election officer which political
4	parties' registrants shall be allowed to vote in the
5	party's primary election.
6	(c) If any political party allows unaffiliated voters to
7	vote in the party's primary election pursuant to subsection
8	(b)(1), an unaffiliated voter may designate any such primary
9	election as the election in which the voter chooses to vote by
10	declaring the designation to the precinct official pursuant to
11	section 11-136 or as provided for absentee voters under section
12	15-4(a) or (e).
13	(d) An unaffiliated voter having declared a designation as
14	provided for in subsection (c) shall not be permitted to vote in
15	the primary election of any other party held on that primary
16	election date.
17	(e) If an unaffiliated voter does not declare a choice of
18	political party's primary election ballot pursuant to subsection

(c), the voter shall not be permitted to vote in any political

party's primary election but shall receive a nonpartisan ballot.

- 1 (f) If any political party allows voters registered with a
- 2 different political party to vote in the party's primary
- 3 election pursuant to subsection (b)(2), a voter registered with
- 4 a different political party may designate any such primary
- 5 election as the election the voter chooses to vote in by
- 6 declaring the designation to the precinct official pursuant to
- 7 section 11-136 or as provided for absentee voters under section
- 8 15-4(a) or (e).
- 9 (q) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit
- 10 an unaffiliated voter from voting in the primary election of a
- 11 different party held in subsequent years.
- 12 (h) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section,
- 13 if a political party allows unaffiliated voters to vote in the
- 14 political party's primary election pursuant to this section, a
- 15 vote by an unaffiliated voter in a political party's primary
- 16 election shall not affect the voter's status as an unaffiliated
- 17 voter.
- 18' (i) For the purposes of this section:
- 19 "Political party" has the same meaning as defined in
- 20 section 11-61.



1 "Primary election" means any primary or special primary 2 election. "Unaffiliated voter" means a voter who is not registered 3 4 with any political party." 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 6 by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 7 "§11- Change of party affiliation. (a) Subject to 8 subsection (b), a voter may change the voter's designation under 9 10 section 11-15(a)(6) as a registrant with a political party or as an unaffiliated voter by filing with the county clerk a signed 11 12 form prescribed by the chief election officer, no later than the 13 deadline for candidates to file nomination papers under section 14 12-6(a). (b) An unaffiliated voter as designated under section 11-15 15(a)(6) may change the voter's designation to that of a 16 registrant with a political party after the deadline set forth 17 in subsection (a) but prior to voting on the day of the primary 18 19 or special primary election, by declaring the designation to the precinct official at a polling location and submitting proof of 20

the voter's registration with the political party in a manner

- prescribed by the chief election officer. The precinct official
  shall then enter the voter's designation in the poll book.
- 3 Following the primary election, the county clerk shall record in
- 4 the voter's registration record the designation entered into the
- 5 poll book."
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 11-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 8 "(a) Any person qualified to and desiring to register as a
- 9 voter in any county shall make and subscribe to an application
- 10 in the form of an affidavit.
- 11 The affidavit shall contain the following information:
- 12 (1) Name;
- 13 (2) Social security number;
- 14 (3) Date of birth;
- 15 (4) Residence, including mailing address;
- 16 (5) That the residence stated in the affidavit is not
- simply because of the person's presence in the State,
- 18 but that the residence was acquired with the intent to
- make Hawaii the person's legal residence with all the
- 20 accompanying obligations therein; [and]
- 21 (6) Designation by the voter as:

12	An applic	ation to register to vote shall include a space to
13	request a perm	anent absentee ballot."
14	SECTION 4	. Section 11-136, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to rea	d as follows:
16	"§11-136	Poll book, identification, voting. Every person
17	upon applying	to vote shall sign the person's name in the poll
18	book prepared	for that purpose. This requirement may be waived
19	by the chairpe	rson of the precinct officials if for reasons of
20	illiteracy or	blindness or other physical disability the voter
21	is unable to w	rite. Every person shall provide identification

- 1 if so requested by a precinct official. A poll book shall not
- 2 contain the social security number of any person.
- 3 After signing the poll book and receiving the voter's
- 4 ballot, the voter shall proceed to the voting booth to vote
- 5 according to the voting system in use in the voter's precinct.
- 6 The precinct official may, and upon request shall, explain to
- 7 the voter the mode of voting.
- 8 For the purpose of providing a voter with the appropriate
- 9 primary election ballot pursuant to section 12- , the poll
- 10 book for primary and special primary elections shall include
- 11 each registered voter's designation under section 11-15(a)(6) as
- 12 a registrant with a political party or as an unaffiliated voter.
- 13 The voter shall declare to the precinct official the voter's
- 14 selection of a primary election ballot pursuant to section 12-
- 15 and the precinct official shall record the declaration in the
- 16 poll book; provided that following the primary election, the
- 17 county clerk shall record as part of the voter's registration
- 18 record the declaration entered into the poll book."
- 19 SECTION 5. Section 12-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:

"§12-21 Official party ballots. The primary or special 1 2 primary ballot shall be clearly designated as such. The names of the candidates of each party qualifying under section 11-61 3 4 or 11-62 and of nonpartisan candidates [may] shall be printed on separate ballots[, or on a single ballot. The name of each 5 party and the nonpartisan-designation shall be distinctly 6 printed and sufficiently separate from each other.] The names 7 of all candidates shall be printed on the ballot as provided in 8 9 section 11-115. When the names of all candidates of the same party for the same office exceed the maximum number of voting 10 positions on a single side of a ballot card, the excess names 11 12 may be arranged and listed on both sides of the ballot card and 13 additional ballot cards if necessary. [When-separate ballots 14 for each party are not used, the order in which parties appear on the ballot, including nonpartisan, shall be determined by 15 16 <del>lot.</del> The chief election officer or the county clerk, in the case 17 of county elections, shall approve printed samples or proofs of 18 the respective party ballots as to uniformity of size, weight, 19 shape, and thickness prior to final printing of the official 20 21 ballots."

SECTION 6. Section 15-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended as follows: 1. By amending subsection (a) to read: 3 4 "(a) Any person registered to vote may request an absentee ballot or permanent absentee ballot in person or in writing from 5 the clerk at any time but not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 6 seventh day prior to the election. Any mailed requests for an 7 absentee ballot or permanent absentee ballot shall be mailed by 8 9 the person directly to the clerk. The clerk may waive any or all of the foregoing requirements in special cases as provided 10 in the rules adopted by the chief election officer. 11 12 The request shall include information such as the person's 13 social security number, date of birth, and the address under which the person is registered to vote. The request shall also 14 include the address to which the person wishes the requested 15 ballot to be forwarded. The request, when made for any primary 16

or special primary election, may include an additional request

for an absentee ballot to be voted at any election immediately

following the primary or special primary; provided the person so

indicates in the person's request.

- As part of a request for a primary or special primary
- 2 absentee ballot under this section, the voter shall declare the
- 3 voter's selection of a primary election ballot pursuant to
- 4 section 12- in the manner prescribed by the chief election
- 5 officer.
- 6 Subsequent to the closing of registration for each
- 7 election, the clerk may mail a request form for an absentee
- 8 ballot and permanent absentee ballot to each voter in a remote
- 9 area who has not already made such a request. The request form
- 10 shall be accompanied by:
- 11 (1) A stamped, self-addressed envelope; and
- 12 (2) Instructions regarding the manner of completing and
- returning the request form."
- 14 2. By amending subsection (e) to read:
- (e) When a registered voter requests an absentee ballot,
- 16 the voter also may include an additional request to receive
- 17 absentee ballots permanently. After receiving a request for
- 18 permanent absentee voter status, the clerk shall mail to the
- 19 voter who requested permanent absentee voter status an absentee
- 20 ballot for all subsequent elections conducted in that

19	entitled	to vote as requested. As soon as the printed official
20	ballots a	re available, the clerk shall mail in a forwarding
21	envelope	or deliver in person if the voter appears at the office

- 12 SECTION 9. (a) This section shall apply only to the
- 13 primary or special primary election immediately following the
- 14 effective date of this Act, whichever occurs first.
- (b) For each voter registered pursuant to part II of
- 16 chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and in conformance with
- 17 this Act to the extent feasible:
- 18 (1) At polling locations, each voter shall declare to the
- 19 precinct official the voter's designation as a
- 20 registrant with a political party or as an
- 21 unaffiliated voter and the voter's choice of ballot,



1		all of which the pretinct official shall record in the
2		poll book;
3	(2)	Absentee voters under chapter 15, Hawaii Revised
4		Statutes, shall declare the voter's designation as a
5		registrant with a political party or as an
6		unaffiliated voter and the voter's choice of ballot
7		pursuant to the procedures set forth in section 15-
8		4(a) and (e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, as amended in
9		section 6 of this Act; provided that each permanent
10		absentee voter shall re-submit a request for a
11		permanent absentee ballot for the purpose of
12		designating the voter's political party or nonpartisan
13		designation; and
14	(3)	Following the election:
15		(A) The county clerk shall record as part of each
16		voter's registration record the voter's political
17		party or nonpartisan designation and choice of
18		ballot entered into the poll book pursuant to

paragraph (1) or as otherwise indicated pursuant

1	(B) For each registered voter who did not vote in the
2	election or who, at the election, did not
3	designate themselves as a registrant with a
4	political party or as an unaffiliated voter, the
5	county clerk shall enter the voter in the
6	registration record as an unaffiliated voter;
7	provided that no voter shall be designated under this section as
8	a registrant of a political party without first providing proof
9	thereof in a manner prescribed by the chief election officer.
10	SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect upon the
13	ratification of a constitutional amendment in compliance with
14	article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of the State of
15	Hawaii, repealing the prohibition against requiring a person to
16	declare a political party preference or nonpartisanship as a
17	condition of voting in any primary or special primary election.
