

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, according to the
- 2 State of Hawaii department of education, nearly twenty-six per
- 3 cent of Nanakuli high school students and more than twenty-seven
- 4 per cent of Waianae high school students fail to graduate within
- 5 four years.
- 6 The legislature further finds that, according to a 2008
- 7 report from the bipartisan organization Fight Crime,
- 8 approximately sixty-eight per cent of people who do not graduate
- 9 from high school are eventually incarcerated.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to establish the Leeward coast
- 11 educational renewal pilot project to quickly implement
- 12 educational reform for schools on the Leeward coast that have a
- 13 history of poor academic performance.
- 14 SECTION 2. (a) The department of education shall
- 15 establish the Leeward coast educational renewal pilot project
- 16 pursuant to this Act.

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1	(b)	The pilot project shall be implemented by a working
2	group. T	he department of education shall invite the following
3	to become	members of the working group:
4	(1)	A representative of the department of education;
5	(2)	A representative of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs;
6	(3)	A representative of the Friends of Hawaii Charities;
7	(4)	A representative of the Kamehameha Schools;
8	(5)	A representative of the Harold K.L. Castle Foundation;
9	(6)	A community leader; and
10	(7)	Other individuals and representatives from other
11		organizations as determined by the working group.
12	(c)	The working group may:
13	(1)	Implement the Berman report recommendations regarding
14		education methodology for Leeward coast schools or may
15		implement other core curriculum;
16	(2)	Construct a vocational-technical school by partnering
17		with unions and other organizations to provide
18		continuing career education, including careers in
19		plumbing, carpentry, agriculture, cosmetology, and
20		automobile repair; and

- (3) Request funds from private and government
 organizations including Kamehameha Schools and the
 Office of Hawaiian Affairs.
- 4 (d) The working group shall elect one of its members to serve as the chair.
- (e) The working group shall be administratively attached
 to the department of education, which shall provide support
 staff for the working group.
- 9 (f) Members of the working group shall serve without
 10 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses
 11 incurred during the performance of their duties.
- (g) The working group shall submit an interim report to
 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
 of the regular session of 2016, and shall submit a final report
 with its findings and recommendations to the legislature no
 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- 18 (h) The working group shall cease to exist on June 30,
 19 2017.
- 20 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much

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- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 2 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 3 2016-2017 for the Leeward coast educational renewal pilot
- 4 project.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 6 of education for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
