A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 328J-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

 "[+]§328J-16[+] Cigarette sales from vending machines and
- 4 by lunch wagons; prohibited. (a) The sale or distribution at
 5 no charge of cigarettes by the following methods is prohibited:
- (1) From cigarette vending machines unless the vending

 machine is located in a bar, cabaret, or any

 establishment for which the minimum age for admission

 is [eighteen;] twenty-one; or
- 10 (2) From a lunch wagon engaging in any sales activity
 11 within one thousand feet of any public or private
 12 elementary or secondary school grounds.
- (b) Violations of subsection (a), including placement of a cigarette vending machine in a location other than a bar, cabaret, or any establishment for which the minimum age for admission is [eighteen,] twenty-one, are subject to a fine of up
- 17 to \$1,000 per day for each violation.

- 1 (c) As used in this section: 2 "Cigarette vending machine" means a self-service device 3 that dispenses cigarettes, cigars, tobacco, or any other product 4 containing tobacco. 5 "Lunch wagon" means a mobile vehicle designed and 6 constructed to transport food and from which food is sold to the 7 general public and includes, but is not limited to, manapua 8 trucks. 9 "Sell" or "sale" means to solicit and receive an order for; 10 to have, keep, offer, or expose for sale; to deliver for value 11 or in any other manner than purely gratuitously; to peddle; to keep with intent to sell; or to traffic in." 12 13 SECTION 2. Section 328J-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 15 This section shall not apply: "(c) 16 Within private commercial establishments, such as (1) 17 stores and restaurants, where tobacco products are 18

1	SECTION 3. Section 328J-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) This section shall not apply to:
4	(1) A duty-free sales enterprise selling duty-free
5	merchandise in accordance with the provisions of title
6	19 United States Code section 1555(b), and any
7	implementing regulations; and
8	(2) Retail tobacco stores, bars, or any other
9	establishment for which the minimum age for admission
10	is [eighteen.] <u>twenty-one.</u> "
11	SECTION 4. Section 709-908, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended to read as follows:
13	"§709-908 Tobacco and electronic smoking devices
14	prohibited; [minors.] persons under twenty-one years of age.
15	(1) It shall be unlawful to sell or furnish tobacco in any
16	shape or form, including chewing tobacco and snuff, or an
17	electronic smoking device, to a [minor] person under [eighteen]
18	twenty-one years of age.
19	(2) Signs using the statement, "The sale of tobacco
20	products or electronic smoking devices to persons under
21	[eighteen] <u>twenty-one</u> is prohibited", shall be posted [on or
22	near any vending machine] in letters at least one-half inch high

- 2 of any other location where tobacco products or electronic
- 3 smoking devices are sold [in letters at least one half inch

- 5 (3) It shall be unlawful for a [minor] person under

- 9 electronic smoking device pursuant to subsection (1). This
- 10 provision does not apply if a person under the age of
- 11 [eighteen,] twenty-one, with parental authorization, is
- 12 participating in a controlled purchase as part of a law
- 13 enforcement activity or a study authorized by the department of
- 14 health under the supervision of law enforcement to determine the

- 17 (4) Any person who violates subsection (1) or (2), or
- 18 both, shall be fined \$500 for the first offense. Any subsequent

- 21 person who violates subsection (3) shall be fined \$10 for the
- 22 first offense. Any subsequent offense shall subject the



- 1 violator to a fine of \$50, no part of which shall be suspended,
- 2 or the person shall be required to perform not less than forty-
- 3 eight hours nor more than seventy-two hours of community service
- 4 during hours when the person is not employed and is not

- 6 (5) For the purposes of this section:
- 7 "Electronic smoking device" means any electronic product
- 8 that can be used to [simulate smoking in the delivery of]
- 9 aerosolize and deliver nicotine or other substances to the
- 10 person inhaling from the device [$\frac{1}{7}$] including, but not limited
- 11 to, an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic
- 12 cigarillo, [ex] electronic pipe, hookah pipe, or hookah pen, and
- 13 any cartridge or other component of the device or related
- 14 product [-], whether or not sold separately."
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 16 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 17 begun before its effective date.
- 18 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.

Electronic Smoking Devices; Tobacco; Cigarettes; Minors

Description:

Increases the minimum age in which one can purchase any tobacco product or electronic smoking device from 18 to 21 years of age. Prohibits the sale or furnishing of tobacco, tobacco products, and electronic smoking devices to persons under 21 years of age. (HB385 HD1)
