A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DOGS IN RESTAURANTS AND BARS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. According to a study by the Hawaiian Humane
- 2 Society, pet owner households comprise 58 per cent of all
- 3 households on Oahu, which is nearly 16 per cent greater than the
- 4 national average.
- 5 A study at the University of Cambridge found that pet
- 6 owners experienced fewer ailments and their overall well-being
- 7 was improved; these health benefits appeared to be linked to pet
- 8 ownership. Documented health benefits of owning a pet,
- 9 particularly a dog, include reduced blood pressure, anxiety, and
- 10 stress; alleviation of depression; elevation of mood; and
- 11 reduced loneliness, all of which can result in fewer visits to a
- 12 physician.
- 13 Additional benefits to owning a pet include an increased
- 14 sense of responsibility, which provides pet owners with
- 15 concomitant mental and emotional stability, improved fitness,
- 16 and the psychological benefits to being in an outdoor
- 17 environment.

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2 over eight hours a day. This does not include additional 3 separation time due to commuting to and from work, completing 4 personal errands, and other situations when a pet owner must 5 complete tasks outside of the home. This separation from the 6 pet owner has been known to cause separation anxiety in 7 domesticated pets, with many dogs experiencing severe to 8 moderate separation anxiety in the absence of their owner. 9 Allowing pet owners to be accompanied by their dogs while 10 patronizing restaurants and bars will serve to increase all the 11 proven benefits associated with pet ownership, as well as reduce 12 the effects of separation experienced by animal companions. 13 The purpose of this Act is to allow restaurant and bar 14 owners and managers, at their discretion, to permit dogs inside 15 a restaurant or bar, subject to certain conditions.

Many pet owners are separated from their companion dogs for

- 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 18 and to read as follows:
- 19 "§321- Dogs allowed in restaurants and bars. (a)
- 20 Notwithstanding any law or rule to the contrary, except as
- 21 provided in subsections (g) and (h), at the discretion of the



1	owner or	manager of a restaurant or bar, a restaurant or bar
2	patron ma	y bring a dog into the restaurant or bar under the
3	following	conditions:
4	<u>(1)</u>	The dog shall be under the control of the patron at
5		all times, on a leash that is tied or fastened to keep
6		the dog within two feet of the patron;
7	(2)	The dog shall remain at the patron's seating area and
8		on the floor;
9	<u>(3)</u>	The dog shall not interfere with the activities of the
10		restaurant or bar's employees, shall not obstruct any
11		pathways, and shall not enter any food preparation
12		areas;
13	(4)	The dog shall not relieve itself within the restaurant
14		or bar, bark, or otherwise disturb other patrons; and
15	(5)	The dog and patron shall abide by any other conditions
16		that the owner or manager of the restaurant or bar may
17		<u>impose.</u>
18	(b)	A restaurant or bar that permits dogs shall have
19	safety and	d sanitation control procedures in effect to:

1	<u>(1)</u>	Immediately clean any animal feces, urine, waste,
2		saliva, vomitus, or other animal fluids, and properly
3		disinfect contaminated areas; and
4	(2)	Prevent animal waste from entering food preparation
5		areas.
6	<u>(c)</u>	A restaurant or bar that permits dogs shall
7	prominent	ly post at each entrance a sign displaying the message
8	"Dogs are	allowed in this establishment." The restaurant or bar
9	shall pos	t, adjacent to that sign, a list of all conditions
10	contained	in subsection (a) and a clear description of any
11	additiona	1 conditions imposed by the owner or manager on dogs
12	present i	n the restaurant or bar.
13	<u>(d)</u>	If any of the conditions in subsection (a) are not
14	met, the	owner or manager of the restaurant or bar may require
15	the patro	n to remove the dog from the premises.
16	<u>(e)</u>	A patron who brings a dog into a restaurant or bar,
17	and the d	og's owner if the owner is not the patron, shall be
18	<u>liable fo</u>	r any and all property damage and personal injury that
19	the dog m	y cause while in the restaurant or bar.
20	(f)	For purposes of this section:

1	"Bar" means an establishment that is devoted to the serving
2	of alcoholic beverages for consumption by guests on the premises
3	regardless of whether food is served, including but not limited
4	to taverns, cocktail lounges, and cabarets, including outdoor
5	areas of bars.
6	"Restaurant" means any place where food is served or
7	provided to the public at a charge, including outdoor seating
8	areas, regardless of whether the food is consumed on or off the
9	premises.
10	(g) If any provisions of this section conflict with
11	federal law governing service animals, federal law shall
12	prevail.
13	(h) Nothing in this section shall diminish the rights of
14	persons with disabilities to request and obtain reasonable
15	accommodations under chapter 489."
16	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
