A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§11- Automatic registration. (a) Notwithstanding any
5	law to the contrary, an affidavit on an application for voter
6	registration shall be a part of the application associated with
7	the issuance of an identification card under section 286-301 and
8	a driver's license under section 286-109. Each application
9	shall include a space to request a permanent absentee ballot.
10	(b) Applications for an identification card or driver's
11	license shall not be processed until the applicant either
12	clearly indicates on the application that the applicant declines
13	to register to vote or completes the portion of the application
14	related to voter registration. Unless an applicant
15	affirmatively declines to be registered to vote, the submission
16	of the application shall be deemed to authorize the examiner of
17	drivers to collect and transmit the information necessary to
18	register the applicant as a voter, and the examiner of drivers

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1	shall electronically transmit the necessary information to the
2	clerk of the county in which the applicant resides and election
3	officials and the statewide voter registration system pursuant
4	to subsection (d). The examiner of drivers shall not transmit
5	any information necessary to register an applicant as a voter if
6	that applicant affirmatively declines to be registered to vote.
7	(c) Upon receipt of the completed voter registration
8	application transmitted from the examiner of drivers, the clerk
9	shall review and either approve or reject the voter registration
10	application in accordance with this part; provided that approved
11	voter registration applications received from the examiner of
12	drivers pursuant to this section shall be treated as having a
13	valid signature for purposes of section 11-15(c) whether
14	transmitted electronically or by facsimile transmission. Upon
15	approval of the voter registration application, the clerk shall
16	proceed to number the application and register the name of the
17	voter in the general county register as provided in section
18	11-14.
19	(d) Databases maintained or operated by the counties or
20	the department of transportation containing driver's license or
21	identification card information, including any documents or

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- 1 images, shall be directly accessible and provided electronically
- 2 to election officials and the statewide voter registration
- 3 system to allow for the timely processing of voter applications,
- 4 ensure the integrity of the voter registration polls, and for
- 5 any other government purpose, as determined by the chief
- 6 election officer."
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding a new section to part VI to be appropriately
- 9 designated and to read as follows:
- 10 "§286-A Voter registration. (a) A qualified applicant
- 11 for a new or renewed motor vehicle driver's license, provisional
- 12 license, or instruction permit shall automatically be registered
- 13 to vote with the clerk of the appropriate county upon completion
- 14 of the license or permit application as required in section
- 15 11- unless the applicant affirmatively declines, on the
- 16 application form, to be registered to vote.
- 17 (b) Unless an applicant affirmatively declines to be
- 18 registered to vote, the submission of the application shall be
- 19 deemed to authorize the examiner of drivers to collect and
- 20 transmit the information necessary to register the applicant as
- 21 a voter, and the examiner of drivers shall electronically

- 1 transmit the necessary information to the clerk of the county in
- 2 which the applicant resides and election officials and the
- 3 statewide voter registration system pursuant to section
- 4 11- (d). The examiner of drivers shall not transmit any
- 5 information necessary to register an applicant as a voter if
- 6 that applicant affirmatively declines to vote.
- 7 (c) For the purposes of this section, "qualified
- 8 applicant" means a person who qualifies to register as a voter
- 9 by law."
- 10 SECTION 3. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to part XVI to be appropriately
- 12 designated and to read as follows:
- 13 "§286-B Voter registration. (a) A qualified applicant
- 14 for a new, renewed, or duplicate identification card shall
- 15 automatically be registered to vote with the clerk of the
- 16 appropriate county upon completion of an application for
- 17 identification card as required by section 11- unless the
- 18 applicant affirmatively declines, on the application form, to be
- 19 registered to vote.
- 20 (b) Unless an applicant affirmatively declines to be
- 21 registered to vote, the submission of the application shall be

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- 1 deemed to authorize the examiner of drivers to collect and
- 2 transmit the information necessary to register the applicant as
- 3 a voter, and the examiner of drivers shall electronically
- 4 transmit the necessary information to the clerk of the county in
- 5 which the applicant resides and election officials and the
- 6 statewide voter registration system pursuant to section
- 7 11- (d). The examiner of drivers shall not transmit any
- 8 information necessary to register an applicant as a voter if
- 9 that applicant affirmatively declines to vote.
- 10 (c) For the purposes of this section, "qualified
- 11 applicant" means a person who qualifies to register as a voter
- 12 by law."
- 13 SECTION 4. Section 286-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 15 "(a) Except as provided in section 286-107.5(a), the
- 16 examiner of drivers shall examine every applicant for a driver's
- 17 license, except as otherwise provided in this part. The
- 18 examination shall include a test of:
- 19 (1) The applicant's eyesight and any further physical
- 20 examination that the examiner of drivers finds

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1		necessary to determine the applicant's fitness to
2	Tive and on the	operate a motor vehicle safely upon the highways;
3	(2)	The applicant's ability to understand highway signs
4		regulating, warning, and directing traffic;
5	(3)	The applicant's knowledge of the rules of the road
6		based on the traffic laws of the State and the traffic
7		ordinances of the county where the applicant resides
8		or intends to operate a motor vehicle; provided that
9		the examination shall specifically test the
10		applicant's knowledge of the provisions of section
11		291C-121.5 and section 291C-137; and
12	(4)	The actual demonstration of ability to exercise
13		ordinary and reasonable control in the operation of a
14		motor vehicle.
15	The examin	nations shall be appropriate to the operation of the
16	category	of motor vehicle for which the applicant seeks to be
17	licensed a	and shall be conducted as required by the director.
18	The e	examiner of drivers shall require every applicant to
19	comply wit	th section 286-102.5.
20	The e	examiner of drivers may waive the actual demonstration
21	of ability	y to operate a motorcycle or motor scooter for any

- 1 person who furnishes evidence, to the satisfaction of the
- 2 examiner of drivers, that the person has completed the
- 3 motorcycle education course approved by the director in
- 4 accordance with section 431:10G-104.
- 5 [At the time of examination, an application for voter
- 6 registration by mail shall be made available to every applicant
- 7 for a driver's license.
- 8 For the purposes of this section, the term "applicant" does
- 9 not include any person reactivating a license under section
- 10 286-107.5(a)."
- 11 SECTION 5. Section 286-109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 "§286-109 General provision governing the issuance of
- 14 licenses. (a) Upon payment of the required fee and upon
- 15 demonstrating the ability to operate a certain category or
- 16 categories of motor vehicles to the satisfaction of the examiner.
- 17 of drivers, an applicant for a driver's license shall be issued
- 18 a single license of a design approved by the director of
- 19 transportation upon which is made a notation of:
- 20 (1) The category or categories of motor vehicles the
- 21 applicant may operate;

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1	(2)	Any restrictive provisions to which the license is
2		subject;

- (3) Veteran status, if desired by the applicant; provided that the notation shall be on the front of the license and shall not include any designation other than the term "veteran"; and
- 7 (4) When the license is issued to a person under twenty8 one years of age, a statement, in clearly legible
 9 print that shall contrast with the other information
 10 appearing on the license, which indicates the date on
 11 which the person will attain the age of twenty-one
 12 years.
- 13 As used in this subsection, "veteran" means any person who
 14 served in any of the uniformed services of the United States and
 15 was discharged under conditions other than dishonorable.
- 16 (b) The examiner of drivers shall not issue or renew any
 17 driver's license using the driver's social security number on
 18 the driver's license.
- 19 (c) Statutes of limitations and other provisions of this
 20 chapter notwithstanding, no driver's license or instruction
 21 permit shall be issued or renewed under this section, where the

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1 examiner of drivers is notified by the district judge, traffic 2 violations bureaus of the district courts, or the judge of the 3 circuit court that the applicant has failed to respond to a traffic citation or summons, or failed to appear in court after 4 5 an arrest for the violation of any traffic laws of a county, 6 this chapter or chapter 286G, 287, 290, 291, or 291C, or of any 7 motor vehicle insurance laws under article 10C of chapter 431, 8 or of any motorcycle or motor scooter insurance laws under 9 article 10G of chapter 431, and the same remains delinquent and 10 outstanding, or the applicant, has as of the time of the 11 application, failed to comply in full with all orders of the 12 court; provided that the district court with whose order an 13 applicant has failed to comply in full, may approve the issuance 14 or renewal of a driver's license or instruction permit other 15 than a commercial driver's license upon conditions imposed by 16 the court for the satisfaction of the outstanding court order 17 and any other conditions as may be imposed by the court, if one 18 or more of the following conditions are met: 19 (1) The applicant is gainfully employed in a position that 20 requires driving and will be discharged if the 21 applicant is unable to drive; or

The applicant has no access to alternative 1 2 transportation and therefore must drive to work; 3 provided further that if the applicant has failed to comply in 4 full with orders of the district court of more than one circuit, 5 the applicant shall obtain the approval of the district court of 6 each circuit in which the applicant has an outstanding court 7 order before a driver's license or instruction permit may be 8 issued or renewed under this subsection. 9 A driver's license or instruction permit issued or renewed 10 under this subsection shall be subject to immediate suspension 11 by the court upon the applicant's failure to remain in full 12 compliance with all conditions imposed by the court for the 13 issuance or renewal of the driver's license or instruction 14 The examiner of drivers may place an indication of 15 restriction upon a driver's license or instruction permit issued 16 or renewed under this subsection. Proof of financial 17 responsibility under section 287-20 shall not apply to the issuance or renewal of driver's licenses or instruction permits 18 19 under this subsection. 20 (d) An application for a driver's license shall include the information required under section 11- ." 21

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- 1 SECTION 6. Section 286-301, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+] §286-301[+] Issuance of identification card or
- 4 temporary card. (a) To obtain an identification card from the
- 5 examiner of drivers, an individual shall complete an application
- 6 pursuant to section 286-303.
- 7 (b) The examiner of drivers, upon receipt of the
- 8 application by any individual who is a resident or a temporary
- 9 resident of this State, shall issue an identification card to
- 10 that individual upon receipt of any appropriate fee established
- 11 pursuant to section 286-309.
- 12 (c) The identification card shall be similar in size,
- 13 shape, and design to a driver's license, but shall not entitle
- 14 the individual to whom it is issued to operate a motor vehicle.
- 15 (d) The issuance of an identification card pursuant to
- 16 this section shall not place upon the State of Hawaii or any
- 17 agency any liability for the misuse or the acceptance of the
- 18 identification card as valid identification, which shall be left
- 19 entirely to the discretion of any individual to whom such card
- 20 is presented.

1 (e) An application for an identification card from the 2 examiner of drivers shall include the information required under section 11- ." 3 4 SECTION 7. Section 286-311, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as 6 follows: 7 "[+] §286-311[+] Custody and use of records; confidential 8 information. (a) [All] Except for purposes of sections 286-A, 9 286-B, 286-109, and 286-301, information and records acquired by 10 the examiner of drivers under this part shall be confidential. All information and records shall be maintained in an 11 12 appropriate form and in an appropriate office in the custody and under the control of the examiner. The information shall be 13 14 available only to authorized individuals under such restrictions 15 as the director shall prescribe. The examiner may dispose of 16 any application or identification card, or information or record relating to the application or identification card, which does 17 not include a social security number, without regard to chapter 18 19 94, whenever, in the examiner's discretion, retention of the 20 information or record is no longer required or practicable."

- 1 SECTION 8. In codifying the new sections added by sections
- 2 and 3 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 3 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 4 the new sections in this Act.
- 5 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.

Automatic Voter Registration; Driver's License; Identification Card; Affirmative Opt-out

Description:

Requires that any person who is eligible to vote and applies for a new or renewed motor vehicle driver's license, provisional license, or instruction permit, or a new, renewed, or duplicate identification card be automatically registered to vote if that person is not already registered to vote unless the applicant affirmatively declines to be registered to vote. Authorizes access to and electronic transmission of databases maintained or operated by the counties or the department of transportation containing driver's license or identification card information to election officials and the statewide voter registration system. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)
