A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIBRARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes, sets 1 2 forth the duties and responsibilities of the board of education. 3 This Act makes housekeeping changes to codify the long-standing 4 board of education and Hawaii state public library system 5 practice of delegating certain duties and responsibilities, which were initially assigned to the board of education, to the 6 7 state librarian and the Hawaii state public library system. 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 10 and to read as follows: "§312- State librarian; appointment; duties. The state 11 12 librarian shall collect, purchase, receive gifts of, and 13 otherwise acquire all books and other publications proper for 14 libraries, and arrange, classify, and catalog the same; provide 15 for their safekeeping; expend moneys appropriated by the 16 legislature and otherwise acquired for the development, use, 17 support, and maintenance of libraries; provide ways and means



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1	for placing libraries within reach of all residents throughout			
2	the State and particularly of all public and private school			
3	children; provide and maintain branch libraries, offices, or			
4	places for the distribution of books and periodicals throughout			
5	the State; enter into contracts as may be necessary to carry			
6	into effect the general duties herein imposed; appoint such			
7	officers and employees as deemed necessary, all of whom shall be			
8	under the authority of the governor for purposes of chapters 76,			
9	78, 89, and 89C; and adopt rules for the management and use of			
10	libraries, and for the control of the property under its			
11	management."			
12	SECTION 3. Section 312-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
13	amended to read as follows:			
14	"§312-1 Duties of the board of education. The board of			
15	education shall care for, manage, and control all property set			
16	apart, donated, loaned to, or in any manner acquired for the use			
17	of libraries; and receive, care for, expend, and account for any			
18	money which may be received for the purpose of erecting			
19	buildings for libraries or for any other purposes of the			
20	libraries[; collect, purchase, receive gifts of, and otherwise			
21	acquire all books and other publications proper for libraries,			



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1	and-arrange, classify, and catalogue the same; provide for their			
2	safekeeping; expend moneys appropriated by the legislature and			
3	otherwise acquired for the development, use, support, and			
4	maintenance of libraries; provide ways and means for placing			
5	libraries within reach of all residents throughout the State and			
6	particularly of all public and private school children; provide			
7	and maintain branch libraries, offices, or places for the			
8	distribution of books and periodicals throughout the State; make			
9	such contracts as may be necessary to carry into effect the			
10	general duties herein imposed; appoint such officers and			
11	employees as it deems necessary; and make rules for the			
12	management and use of libraries, and for the control of the			
13	property under its management]."			
14	SECTION 4. Section 312-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
15	amended to read as follows:			
16	"§312-2 Powers of board; special fund. The board of			
17	education may:			
18	(1) Except as provided in section 312-3.9, make			
19	arrangements or contracts as are approved by the			
20	governor, with any county, city, association, society,			



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1 person, or persons, for the purpose of benefiting the 2 libraries and increasing their facilities and use; 3 (2)Subject to section 26-12, enter into such arrangement 4 or contract as is approved by the governor, with the 5 Friends of the Library of Hawaii, affiliates of the 6 Friends of the Library of Hawaii, and any tax-exempt 7 nonprofit organization recognized under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code whose primary 8 9 purpose is to support a state library branch for the 10 purpose of obtaining the use of the books and property 11 and income of the Friends of the Library of Hawaii, its affiliates, and such tax-exempt nonprofit 12 13 organizations; 14 (3) Cooperate by exchange and otherwise with libraries now existing or hereafter to be formed; 15 Receive, use, manage, or invest moneys or other (4) 16 17 property, real, personal, or mixed which may be given, 18 bequeathed, devised, or in any manner received from 19 sources other than the legislature or any federal 20 appropriation for any or all purposes of the 21 libraries;



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1 Deposit with the director of finance in a special fund (5) 2 all moneys donated to the board for library services; 3 . Unless otherwise provided for by the terms and (6) 4 conditions of the donation, convert, at such time as 5 the board may at its sole discretion determine, /any or 6 all donations of property, real, personal, or mixed, 7 into money to be deposited into the special fund; and 8 (7) Expend the moneys in the special fund in accordance 9 with the terms and conditions of each donation for the 10 purposes of the libraries. 11 The board shall be the trustee of the special fund and all 12 moneys therein shall be deemed to have been appropriated to the 13 use and for the purposes of the [board] Hawaii state public

15 section shall be construed to limit the powers and duties of the 16 board hereinbefore expressed, or to empower the board to 17 obligate the State financially in any sum which shall not have 18 been appropriated by the legislature for the use of the board." 19 SECTION 5. Section 312-4.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended as follows:

5 (1) Any cost or expense incurred by the Hawaii state 6 public library system as a result of any action taken 7 to enforce the collection of costs of lost books and 8 any overdue fines and fees charged to that patron 9 after the public library system has mailed written 10 notice demanding payment and advising that continued 11 failure to pay the amount due may result in collection 12 action being taken, including the imposition of cost-13 recovery fees, not to exceed \$10, pursuant to this 14 section. Any cost-recovery fee charged against the 15 patron for costs, fees, and other charges may include 16 collection agency fees, attorneys' fees, court filing 17 fees, and similar fees incurred by the Hawaii state 18 public library system in connection with the 19 collection action;

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

 of the additional fees to be charged by the collection
 agency prior to the referral to the collection
 agency."

5 SECTION 6. Section 312-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 "\$312-5 Annual report to the governor. Annually during 8 the month of July but as of June 30 preceding, the [board of 9 education] state librarian shall report to the governor the 10 moneys received from all sources and expended for all purposes 11 during the preceding year, and any other matters pertaining to 12 the libraries which it may deem important, or the governor may 13 require."

SECTION 7. Section 312-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: "(a) The [board-of education, through the] state librarian[-] shall:

18 (1) Provide for the establishment and ongoing operation of
19 a fee for enhanced service program, which includes but
20 is not limited to the planning, programming, and



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budgeting of operating, research and development, and 1 2 capital investment programs; and 3 (2) Administer a special fund to be known as the "library fee for enhanced services special fund"." 4 5 SECTION 8.
