### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	HAWAII GIVE BACK FOR PAYBACK LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM
6	§ -1 Hawaii give back for payback loan forgiveness
7	program; purpose. The Hawaii give back for payback loan
8	forgiveness program is established to encourage newly graduated
9	professionals to pursue public service in a not-for-profit
10	organization designated as tax-exempt by the Internal Revenue
11	Service under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as
12	amended.
13	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
14	context clearly indicates otherwise:
15	"Department" means the department of budget and finance.
16	"Director" means the director of budget and finance.

- 1 "Loan repayment" means the payment, per year, of up to
- 2 per cent of a program participant's professional training costs,
- 3 for a maximum of 10 years.
- 4 "Program" means the Hawaii give back for payback loan
- 5 forgiveness program.
- 6 § -3 Hawaii give back for payback loan forgiveness
- 7 program; established. (a) There is established the Hawaii give
- 8 back for payback loan forgiveness program to be administered by
- 9 the department. The program shall provide student loan
- 10 repayments to professionals employed by a not-for-profit
- 11 organization designated as tax-exempt by the Internal Revenue
- 12 Service under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as
- 13 amended, and who make the public service commitments required by
- 14 this chapter. The department shall prioritize student loan
- 15 repayments in accordance with the greatest need for public
- 16 service work.
- 17 (b) The program shall provide student loan repayments on
- 18 behalf of a professional who agrees to serve for at least
- 19 consecutive years, as determined by the department.
- (c) In administering the program, the director shall:

1	(1)	Establish criteria and a certification process for	
2		what constitutes eligible public service work;	
3	(2)	Establish criteria for the selection of college	
4		graduates employed by a not-for-profit organization	
5		designated as tax-exempt by the Internal Revenue	
6		Service under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal	
7		Revenue Code, as amended;	
8	(3)	Collect and manage reimbursements from program	
9		participants who do not meet their service commitments	
10		under the program; and	
11	(4)	Solicit and accept grants and donations from public	
12		and private sources for the program, including	
13		maximizing the use of federal matching funds.	
14	(d)	Eligible participants in the program shall be	
15	determine	d by the department on a competitive basis.	
16	(e)	If a program participant fails to satisfy the	
17	participant's service commitment under subsection (b), the		
18	program p	articipant shall be liable for the repayment of the	
19	outstandi	ng balance of the loan to the appropriate lending	

financial institution.

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- 1 § -4 Rules. The department shall adopt rules to
- 2 administer this chapter.
- 3 § -5 Hawaii give back for payback loan forgiveness
- 4 program revolving fund. (a) There is established in the
- 5 treasury of the State a Hawaii give back for payback loan
- 6 forgiveness program revolving fund, which shall be administered
- 7 by the department and into which shall be deposited:
- 8 (1) Appropriations made by the legislature to the fund;
- 9 (2) Gifts, donations, and grants from government agencies
- and private individuals;
- 11 (3) Moneys received as reimbursements of loan repayments
- 12 under the program;
- 13 (4) Interest earned or accrued on moneys deposited into
- 14 the fund; and
- 15 (5) Any other moneys made available to the program from
- 16 other sources.
- 17 (b) The department may expend moneys from the fund for the
- 18 purposes of this chapter, including operational expenses
- 19 required to administer the program.
- 20 § -6 Report. Beginning with the regular session of
- 21 2017, the director shall report to the legislature on the status

- 1 of the program no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 2 of each regular session."
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 for
- 6 deposit into the Hawaii give back for payback loan forgiveness
- 7 program revolving fund.
- 8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii give
- 9 back for payback loan forgiveness program revolving fund the sum
- 10 of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 11 year 2015-2016 to establish and administer the Hawaii give back
- 12 for payback loan forgiveness program.
- 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 14 budget and finance for the purposes of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. The department of budget and finance shall
- 16 implement the Hawaii give back for payback loan forgiveness
- 17 program required by section 1 of this Act no later than June 30,
- **18** 2016.

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
