

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

I	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are nearly
3	10,000 pesticides registered for use in Hawaii. The department
4	of agriculture is responsible for ensuring pesticides are used
5	correctly in Hawaii. The legislature further finds that it is
6	in the interest of the public to enhance the ability of the
7	department of agriculture and the University of Hawaii college
8	of tropical agriculture and human resources to respond to
9	questions about pesticide use and make recommendations regarding
10	pesticides for the protection of public safety and the
11	environment. The legislature concludes that this can best be
12	accomplished by increasing the pesticide licensing fee and
13	amending the authorized uses of the pesticide use revolving
14	fund.
15	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
16	(1) Increase the pesticide licensing fee;

1	(2)	Amend authorized uses for moneys in the pesticide use
2		revolving fund;
3	(3)	Establish an environmental toxicologist position
4		within the department of agriculture and a pesticide
5		extension specialist, through a contract with the
6		department of agriculture, within the University of
7		Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
8		resources;
9	(4)	Appropriate funds out of the pesticide use revolving
10		fund for specific purposes; and
11	(5)	Remove the sunset date of Act 168, Session Laws of
12		Hawaii 2010, thereby making permanent the removal of
13		the requirement that the pesticide use revolving fund
14		be used only for limited personnel costs.
15		PART II
16	SECT	ION 2. Section 149A-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
18	"(b)	The licensee shall pay $[\$75]$ $\$310$ for each year, or
19	fraction	thereof, that the pesticide is licensed. Licensing
20	fees may	be increased or decreased from time to time by rules
21	and may v	ary according to the amount or quantity of pesticide to

- 1 be sold, offered for sale, or distributed. [The term of the
- 2 license shall be for a period of up to three years. A] Every
- 3 license shall expire on December 31 [of the third] each year.
- 4 In case of renewal of license, a statement shall be required
- 5 only with respect to information which is different from that
- 6 furnished when the pesticide was licensed or last relicensed."
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 149A-13.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "\$149A-13.5 Pesticide use revolving fund; [pesticide
- 10 training workshops;] uses; training fee. (a) There is
- 11 established within the treasury of the State, a pesticide use
- 12 revolving fund. The fund shall be administered by the
- 13 department for the purposes of this section. The fund shall
- 14 consist of:
- 15 (1) Licensing and registration fees and charges collected
- by the department under section 149A-13(b);
- 17 (2) All fees collected by the department through the
- 18 collection of training fees in accordance with
- 19 subsection (c); and

1	(3)	runus appropriated for the pesticide substay program
2		established under Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii
3		2014.
4	(b)	[Moneys in the pesticide use revolving fund shall be
5	expended	by the department to support the pesticide program's
6	registrat	ion and licensing, certification and education, and
7	complianc	e monitoring activities. The department shall also
8	expend r e	volving fund moneys on the establishment of pesticide
9	training	workshops, educational programs, development of
10	integrat e	d pest management strategies, the pesticide subsidy
11	program c	reated under Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, and
12	other ser	vices for pesticide users such as the agricultural pest
13	control i	ndustry, the structural pest control industry, and
14	consumer	users of pesticides, which provide pesticide
15	instructi	on in areas-including the collection, disposal, and
16	recycling	of pesticide containers and all other pesticide

19 services, materials, and equipment for the purposes of this

pesticide use revolving fund may be used for personnel,

20 section. Moneys in the revolving fund shall be expended by the

services deemed necessary by the department.] Moneys from the

21 department for:

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1	(1)	Registration and technical review;
2	(2)	Certification, including certification of restricted
3		use pesticides or experimental use pesticides;
4	(3)	Compliance monitoring activities;
5	(4)	Development of an electronic data collection system
6		for all required pesticide reporting;
7	<u>(5)</u>	Personnel costs, including the hiring of necessary
8		<pre>staff;</pre>
9	<u>(6)</u>	Development of pesticide-related educational materials
10		in conjunction with the University of Hawaii college
11		of tropical agriculture and human resources;
12	(7)	Demonstration trials in conjunction with the
13		University of Mawaii college of tropical agriculture
14		and human resources cooperative extension service
15		agents to develop integrated management and drift
16		management technologies; and
17	(8)	A pesticide disposal program.
18	The	department shall also expend revolving fund moneys on
19	the pesti	cide subsidy program created under Act 105, Session
20	Laws of H	awaii 2014, and shall partner with the University of
21	Hawaii co	llege of tropical agriculture and human resources to

- 1 expend revolving fund moneys on the establishment of pesticide
- 2 education programs and pesticide training programs and for the
- 3 establishment of a position of pesticide extension specialist.
- 4 [Moneys expended by the department from the pesticide use
- 5 revolving fund for training-workshops, educational programs, and
- 6 other services for the agricultural pest control industry, the
- 7 structural pest control industry, and consumer groups shall be
- 8 expended in a manner that appropriately addresses the needs of
- 9 cach category of pesticide user.]
- 10 (c) The department may set fees for [the] any educational
- 11 [services] programs and training programs provided under this
- 12 section.
- (d) All interest earned on the deposit or investment of
- 14 the moneys in the fund shall become a part of the fund.
- 15 [(e) All unobligated, unencumbered, or unexpended funds
- 16 remaining in the fund in excess of \$250,000 at the close of each
- 17 fiscal year shall lapse to the state general fund.
- 18 $\frac{(f)}{(f)}$ (e) The department shall submit an annual report to
- 19 the legislature on all moneys deposited into, and disbursed
- 20 from, the pesticide use revolving fund. The report shall be
- 21 submitted to the legislature not fewer than twenty days prior to

1	the convening of each regular session. The report shall
2	[group]:
3	(1) Group all moneys deposited into, and disbursed from,
4	the revolving fund according to the categories
5	established in subsections (a) to [(e).] (d);
6	(2) Include recommendations to improve pesticide education
7	and regulatory processes within the State; and
8	(3) Include recommendations for budget reallocations for
9	the subsequent fiscal year."
10	PART III
11	SECTION 4. (a) The department of agriculture and the
12	University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
13	resources shall execute a memorandum of understanding regarding
14	the expenditure of moneys from the pesticide use revolving fund
15	pursuant to section 149A-13.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes.
16	(b) No later than twenty days prior to the regular session
17	of 2016, and each regular session thereafter, the department of
18	agriculture and University of Hawaii college of tropical
19	agriculture and human resources shall submit a report to the

- 1 revolving fund in accordance with the memorandum of
- 2 understanding required under subsection (a).
- 3 SECTION 5. (a) There is established within the department
- 4 of agriculture the position of an environmental toxicologist.
- 5 The position shall be exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii Revised
- 6 Statutes. The position shall partner with the department of
- 7 health toxicologist to expand the technical capacity of the
- 8 departments of agriculture and health to analyze findings and
- 9 make recommendations regarding environmental and human health.
- 10 (b) There shall be a memorandum of understanding between
- 11 the department of agriculture environmental toxicologist and the
- 12 department of health toxicologist that defines a collaborative
- 13 relationship between the two positions.
- 14 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 15 revolving fund the sum of \$200,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 16 necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much
- 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
- 18 operating expenses and the position of environmental
- 19 toxicologist established under section 5 of this Act.
- 20 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 21 of agriculture exclusively for the purposes of this Act.

1	SECT	ON 7. There is established within the University of
2	Hawaii col	llege of tropical agriculture and human resources the
3	position o	of pesticide extension specialist, to be funded by the
4	pesticide	use revolving fund through a contract with the
5	department	of agriculture. The pesticide extension specialist
6	shall be :	responsible for:
7	(1)	Developing educational materials in conjunction with
8		the department of agriculture pursuant to section
9		149A-13.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes;
10	(2)	Working with the environmental toxicologist
11		established under section 5 of this Act to design
12		experiments; and
13	(3)	Exploring partnerships with other agencies for funding
14		opportunities.
15	SECT	ION 8. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
16	revolving	fund the sum of \$200,000 or so much thereof as may be
17	necessary	for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much
18	thereof as	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
19	operating	expenses and the position of a pesticide extension
20	specialis	established under section 7 of this Act.

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of agriculture exclusively for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 PART IV
- 4 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 5 revolving fund the sum of \$25,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 6 necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
- 8 registration and technical review.
- 9 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 10 revolving fund the sum of \$25,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 11 necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much
- 12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
- 13 certification activities, including certification of restricted
- 14 use pesticides or experimental use pesticides.
- 15 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 16 revolving fund the sum of \$300,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 17 necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for
- 19 compliance monitoring expenses.
- 20 SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 21 revolving fund the sum of \$750,000 or so much thereof as may be

- 1 necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much
- 2 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 3 development of an electronic data collection system.
- 4 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 5 revolving fund the sum of \$400,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 6 necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 8 development of pesticide-related educational materials.
- 9 SECTION 14. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 10 revolving fund the sum of \$300,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 11 necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much
- 12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to conduct
- 13 demonstration trials in conjunction with the University of
- 14 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources
- 15 cooperative extension service agents to develop integrated
- 16 management and drift management technologies.
- 17 SECTION 15. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 18 revolving fund the sum of \$500,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 19 necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the same sum or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 21 pesticide disposal program.



1	SECTION 16. The sums appropriated by sections 9 to 15
2	shall be expended by the department of agriculture exclusively
3	for the purposes of this Act.
4	PART V
5	SECTION 17. Act 168, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, is
6	amended by amending section 4 to read as follows:
7	"SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010[$ au$
8	provided that this Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2015, and
9	section 149A 13.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be
10	reenacted in the form in which it read on June 30, 2010]."
11	PART VI
12	SECTION 18. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 19. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015;
15	provided that sections 3 and 17 of this Act shall take effect on
16	June 29, 2015.
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Report Title:

Pesticides; Licensing; Fees; Pesticide Use Revolving Fund; Appropriation

Description:

Increases the pesticide licensing fee. Amends authorized uses for moneys in the pesticide use revolving fund. Requires memorandum of understanding between the department of agriculture and the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources regarding the expenditure of funds from the pesticide use revolving fund and a report to the legislature. Establishes an environmental toxicologist position within the department of agriculture and a pesticide extension specialist, through a contract with the department of agriculture, within the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources. Appropriates funds out of the pesticide use revolving fund for specific purposes. Removes the sunset date of Act 168, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010.

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
