A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HERITAGE BREED ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. For centuries, people throughout the world have
bred and raised thousands of different animal breeds. Although
there is no agreed-upon definition of heritage breed animals,
heritage breed animals are generally considered to be animals
that are bred over time to be best adapted to local conditions.
Many heritage breed animals are found in geographically isolated
areas such as the Hawaiian islands.

8 In the 1700's, explorers brought sheep and goats to Hawaii. 9 Since their arrival, these animals adapted to Hawaii's unique 10 climate, became an integral part of Hawaiian culture as a 11 sustainable food resource, contributed to Hawaii's early 12 economy, and continue to be a valuable food resource.

13 The legislature finds that Hawaii is home to unique breeds 14 of heritage breed animals. For example, Mauna Kea sheep are 15 believed to be the original uncontaminated feral sheep because 16 of isolation. Their unique form, developed over the past one

hundred fifty years, makes this species worthy of genetic and
serologic evaluation, in captivity or in the wild.

3 The legislature further finds that Hawaii's heritage breed 4 animal population may potentially play a vital role in 5 preservation of genetic diversity within the world's livestock 6 species. Hawaii's wild sheep and goat population play a role in 7 today's land management and fire control practices. These 8 animals also provide locally-harvested sources of protein that 9 contribute to Hawaii's sustainability. Accordingly, the 10 legislature believes that Hawaii should prioritize preserving 11 the existing genotypes of its sheep and goats to ensure their 12 conservation as relics of Hawaii's past and as a valuable and 13 unique resource that Hawaii is fortunate to have today. The 14 legislature further finds that efforts should be made to 15 conserve Hawaii's unique heritage breed livestock by identifying and studying them and, if possible, acquiring examples of 16 17 heritage breed species to breed and raise in captivity.

18 The purpose of this Act is to direct the University of 19 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources to 20 conduct a study and inventory of heritage breed animals in 21 Hawaii.

(1)	A definition of the term "heritage breed animal" as it
	applies in Hawaii and the identification of any such
	species in Hawaii;
(2)	Identification of any causes or factors that may have
	or are currently contributing to the decline or
	extinction of heritage breed animals;
(3)	A survey of farmers that are raising heritage breed
	animals;
(4)	An assessment of existing and potential future demand
	in the State for products derived from heritage breed
	animals;
(5)	An evaluation of the impact of hunting on populations
	of heritage breed animals; and
(6)	An analysis of possible benefits of breeding heritage
	breed animals in captivity.

1	(b) In carrying out the duties prescribed in subsection
2	(a), the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture
3	and human resources may consult with the following:
4	(1) The state archives;
5	(2) Conservation organizations;
6	(3) State historians;
7	(4) The United States Department of Agriculture National
8	Agricultural Statistics Service; and
9	(5) Any other person or entity it deems appropriate.

15	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general

17	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015–2016 and the
18	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
19	2016-2017 for the study and inventory of heritage breed animals.
