A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII ATHLETICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Over forty years ago, the United States
 Congress passed Public Law 92-318, Title IX of the federal
- 3 Education Amendments of 1972, renamed the Patsy Mink Equal
- 4 Opportunity in Education Act in 2002. Title IX mandates: "No
- 5 person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be
- 6 excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be
- 7 subjected to discrimination under any education program or
- 8 activity receiving federal financial assistance."
- $oldsymbol{9}$ One of the most visible impacts of Title IX is in
- 10 athletics. With respect to athletic programs, the United States
- 11 Department of Education evaluates several factors in determining
- 12 whether equal treatment exists, including, but not limited to:
- 13 whether the selection of sports and levels of competition
- 14 effectively accommodate the interests and abilities of members
- 15 of both sexes, the provision of equipment and supplies,
- 16 scheduling of games and practice time, travel and per diem

- 1 allowance, and the provision of locker room, practice, and
- 2 competitive facilities.
- 3 As a recipient of federal funds, the University of Hawaii
- 4 must comply with Title IX. For example, in order to have a
- 5 football team composed of all male athletes, a corresponding
- 6 number of opportunities for women athletes is required.
- 7 The legislature finds that compliance with Title IX and
- 8 funding of athletics at the University of Hawaii is a matter of
- 9 statewide concern.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to support the University of
- 11 Hawaii in meeting this federal mandate.
- 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by adding four new sections to part V to be
- 14 appropriately designated and to read as follows:
- 15 "\$304A- The University of Hawaii at Manoa athletics
- 16 department; program identification number. All appropriations
- 17 to the University of Hawaii at Manoa athletics department in the
- 18 general appropriations act and supplemental appropriations act
- 19 shall be designated by a program identification number separate
- 20 from all other University of Hawaii program identification
- 21 numbers.

- 8 SECTION 3. The University of Hawaii shall submit an annual
- 9 report to the legislature, no later than twenty days prior to
- 10 the convening of each regular session, regarding the status of
- 11 implementation of this Act and the following:
- 12 (1) Annual revenues and expenditures of the University of
- 13 Hawaii at Manoa athletics department, segregated by
- women's teams and men's teams;
- 15 (2) Allocation of revenue to women's teams and men's teams
- 16 from media revenues, student fees, donations, and
- other sources; and
- 18 (3) Average cost of each student athlete, including the
- 19 costs of coaches, trainers, meals, travel, facilities,
- and uniforms.

- 1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,000,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 for the
- 4 University of Hawaii at Manoa athletics department.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 6 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act; provided that the sum
- 7 appropriated shall be in addition to the base budget of the
- 8 University of Hawaii set forth in House Bill No. 1700, regular
- **9** session of 2016.
- 10 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016, and
- 12 shall be repealed on June 30, 2021.

Report Title:

UH Athletics; Scholarship; Title IX; Self-Sufficiency; Appropriation

Description:

Requires that the UH-Manoa athletics department be a separate program ID in the state budget act. Requires that tuition waiver and scholarship funds be transferred to the UH-Manoa athletic department. Prohibits allocation of general funds to the UH-Manoa athletic department except for Title IX compliance. Requires that UH-Manoa men's teams collectively be self-sufficient. Requires UH to report annually. Repealed 6/30/21. Appropriates funds. (HD1 Proposed)
