A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. According to the United States Department of
Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics, the growth in jobs for
registered nurses is expected to increase 19 per cent from 2012
to 2022. Future job prospects for the nursing profession look
positive in light of an aging population, healthcare reform

6 changes, increasing demands for health care services, and

7 greater emphasis on preventative care. However, new nurse

 ${f 8}$ graduates and newly-licensed nurses are finding it difficult to

9 secure a job in the State, particularly since the job market

10 seeks nurses with expanded competencies.

The legislature finds that although there are nursing jobs available in primary care and acute care settings, these jobs require nurses with experience. The transition from student nurse to clinical practitioner is challenging. New nurse graduates have the legal and professional requirements of competence to enter practice, but lack some of the practice

17 readiness skills necessary to navigate a clinical environment.

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- 1 To fill nurse positions, especially in specialized settings such
- 2 as emergency rooms, operating rooms, and intensive care units,
- 3 Hawaii hospitals have had to rely on traveling nurses and
- 4 recruit and import nurses from out of state to address shortage
- 5 areas despite the number of new nurse graduates in the State
- 6 each year.
- 7 The Institute of Medicine report, "The Future of Nursing:
- 8 Leading Change, Advancing Health, " recommends that "state boards
- 9 of nursing, accrediting bodies, the federal government, and
- 10 health care organizations should take actions to support nurses'
- 11 completion of a transition-to-practice program (nurse residency)
- 12 after they have completed a prelicensure or advanced practice
- 13 degree program or when they are transitioning into new clinical
- 14 practice areas." A nurse residency program supports new nurse
- 15 graduates and newly-licensed nurses as they transition from
- 16 student to professional nurse by providing varied learning and
- 17 work experiences that focus on knowledge application and
- 18 professional development.
- 19 The legislature finds that a nurse residency program for
- 20 new nurse graduates and newly-licensed nurses will help address
- 21 the State's critical shortage of primary and acute care



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the transition to clinical care settings and the establishment
of their careers. A nurse residency program will also address
the experience gap that is occurring in the nursing profession
as seasoned nurses begin to retire and the ratio of new nurse
graduates to experienced nurses increases. Nurses who complete
a residency program will be highly qualified and competent to
fill needed health care provider roles and deliver high quality

providers, particularly in rural areas, by assisting nurses in

building and investing in a strong workforce in the State by
retaining in-state nurse graduates who pursue further study and
employment in the State through the residency program.

- The purpose of this Act is to establish a statewide nurse residency program within the University of Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing and dental hygiene to transition new nurse graduates and newly-licensed nurses to a clinical workplace, promote career advancement within the nursing profession, and improve delivery of high quality patient care.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 21 and to read as follows:
