A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMUNITY CARE FOSTER FAMILY HOMES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is an ever-
- 2 increasing need for community care foster family homes to
- 3 support the health and long-term care needs of an aging
- 4 population and families. Community care foster family homes
- 5 provide an essential function in the State by providing twenty-
- 6 four-hour living accommodations, which include housing,
- 7 supervision, personal care, and assistance with daily living
- 8 activities for their residents. These homes provide individuals
- 9 who are at a nursing facility level of care with living
- 10 accommodations in a family-like setting, an alternative to
- 11 living in an institutional setting.
- 12 Community care foster family homes are licensed to provide
- 13 accommodations and services to not more than two adults at any
- 14 one time, at least one of whom shall be a medicaid recipient,
- 15 and who are at the nursing facility level of care. The
- 16 department of health may certify a community care foster family
- 17 home for a third adult who is at the nursing level of care and a
- 18 medicaid recipient, provided certain requirements are met.

- 1 The legislature further finds that not only do medicaid
- 2 clients have limited options for long-term care, but so do
- 3 individuals who do not rely on medicaid for long-term care.
- 4 Besides providing accommodations to medicaid recipients,
- 5 community care foster family homes also provide accommodations
- 6 to private-pay individuals. There is also a recognized need to
- 7 accommodate private-pay individuals who share a long-term
- 8 relationship. As the cost of medical care continues to rise, it
- 9 is becoming apparent that even those who do not rely on medicaid
- 10 for their long-term care cannot afford the cost of private care,
- 11 leaving this population, also, with limited options.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to recognize the varied needs of
- 13 the State's aging population by allowing the department of
- 14 health flexibility to permit two private-pay individuals to be
- 15 cared for in the same community care foster family home,
- 16 provided they meet certain qualifying conditions.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 321-481, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by amending the definition of "community care foster
- 19 family home" or "home" to read as follows:
- ""Community care foster family home" or "home" means a home
- 21 that:

10		level of care, who are unrelated to the foster family,

14		(A) The department, in its discretion, may allow two	
15		private-pay individuals to be cared for in the	
16		same community care foster family home if all of	
17		the following criteria are met:	
18		(i) The community care foster family home is	
19		certified for three beds;	
20		(ii) Operators of three-bed community care foster	
21		family homes immediately notify the	

1		department or its designee of any vacancy in
2		writing; and
3	<u>(iii)</u>	Two of the three nursing level clients are
4		in a relationship with each other as a
5		married or civil union couple; provided
6		further that the department, in its
7		discretion, may disregard the payor status
8		of the clients in a married or civil union
9		relationship and may redesignate at least
10		one of the two private-pay beds to a
11		Medicaid bed when the couple's relationship
12		ceases to exist in the home; and
13	(B) The c	department, in its discretion, may certify a
14	home	for a third adult who is at the nursing
15	faci	lity level of care and a medicaid recipient;
16	prov	ided further that the:
17	[(A)] <u>(i)</u>	Home has been certified and in operation for
18		not less than one year;
19	[(B)] <u>(ii)</u>	Primary caregiver is a certified nurse aide,
20		as defined in section 457A-1.5, who has
21		completed a state-approved training program

3	[(C)] <u>(iii)</u> S	Substitute caregiver is a nurse aide, as

8	(3) Does not in	nclude expanded adult residential care homes			
9	or assisted	l living facilities."			
10	SECTION 3. The	department of health shall submit a report			
11	of its findings and r	recommendations to the legislature no later			
12	than twenty days pric	or to the convening of the regular session			
13	of 2016 on the author	rization to allow two private-pay			
14	individuals to be cared for in the same community care foster				
15	family home as provided under this Act, including its impact on				
16	the availability of space for medicaid clients.				
17	SECTION 4. It i	s the intent of this Act not to jeopardize			
18	the receipt of any fe	ederal aid. If this Act is found to be in			
19	conflict with federal	requirements that are a prescribed			
20	condition for the allocation of federal funds to the State, thi				
21	Act shall be deemed void.

- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
