H.B. NO. 612

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in 2014, the office 2 of elections postponed voting for two precincts in the Puna 3 district of Hawaii island that did not open on the day of the 4 primary election because of nearby damage caused by Tropical Storm Iselle. The postponement of voting by nearly a week for 5 6 the affected precincts demonstrated the unique challenges that 7 may arise when partial election results are released to the 8 public for ballot contests that are still undetermined pending 9 the results of postponed voting. For example, the two leading 10 candidates in the Democratic primary race for the United States Senate were separated by only 1,635 votes, with an estimated 11 6,821 voters eligible to participate in the postponed vote. 12 13 This situation prompted concerns that prior knowledge of the 14 status of ongoing election contests heading into the postponed 15 vote could skew election results by changing voter behavior or 16 providing candidates and other interested parties with the



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unusual advantage of focusing campaign efforts on specific
groups of swing voters.

The legislature further finds that the release of partial election results prior to the completion of postponed balloting undermines the current general policy of prohibiting the disclosure of voting results prior to the closing of the polls, as set forth in section 11-152(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes.

8 The purpose of this Act is to promote fairness in the 9 conduct of postponed elections, by prohibiting the public 10 disclosure of voting results from every precinct for any ballot 11 contest or question affected by the postponement, until the 12 closing of the polls for the postponed election.

13 SECTION 2. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 14 by adding a new section to part X to be appropriately designated 15 and to read as follows:

16 "<u>§11-</u> Postponed elections; disclosure of voting

17 results. Whenever the conduct of an election within any

18 precinct has been postponed:

19 (1) By the chief election officer or county clerk because 20 of a natural disaster pursuant to section 11-92.3;



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(2) By the governor during a state of emergency pursuant 1 2 to section 127A-13(a)(9); or For any other reason as may be authorized by law, -3 (3) the disposition of votes cast for each candidate or question 4 5 appearing on the ballot for the postponed election, from any precinct whether or not designated for postponement, including 6 7 votes cast by absentee ballot, shall not be disclosed to the public until the closing of the polls for the postponed 8 9 election." 10 SECTION 3. Section 11-92.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 11 12 "(a) In the event of a flood, tsunami, earthquake, volcanic eruption, high wind, or other natural disaster, 13 14 occurring prior to an election, that makes a precinct inaccessible, the chief election officer or county clerk in the 15 case of county elections may consolidate precincts within a 16 17 representative district. If the extent of damage caused by any 18 natural disaster is such that the ability of voters, in any precinct, district, or county, to exercise their right to vote 19 is substantially impaired, the chief election officer or county 20 clerk in the case of county elections may require the registered 21



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voters of the affected precinct to vote by absentee ballot 1 2 pursuant to section 15-2.5 and may postpone the conducting of an 3 election in the affected precinct for no more than twenty-one 4 days; provided that any such postponement shall not affect the 5 conduct of the election, tabulation, or distribution of results 6 for those precincts, districts, or counties not designated for 7 postponement [-], except as otherwise provided in section 11-8 The chief election officer or county clerk in the case of county 9 elections shall give notice of the consolidation, postponement, 10 or requirement to vote by absentee ballot, in the affected 11 county or precinct prior to the opening of the precinct polling 12 place by whatever possible news or broadcast media are available. Precinct officials and workers affected by any 13 14 consolidation shall not forfeit their pay."

15 SECTION 4. Section 11-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is16 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

17 "(b) In those precincts using the electronic voting 18 system, the ballots shall be taken in the sealed ballot boxes to 19 the counting center according to the procedure and schedule 20 promulgated by the chief election officer to promote the 21 security of the ballots. In the presence of official observers,



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1 counting center employees may start to count the ballots prior to the closing of the polls; provided that there shall be no 2 3 printout by the computer or other disclosure of the number of 4 votes cast for a candidate or on a question prior to the closing 5 of the polls [-], subject to the provisions of section 11for 6 the disclosure of votes in the event of a postponed election. 7 For the purposes of this section, the closing of the polls is 8 that time identified in section 11-131 as the closing hour of 9 voting."

10 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
