A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PAPAHANAUMOKUAKEA MARINE NATIONAL MONUMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	PAPAHANAUMOKUAKEA MARINE NATIONAL MONUMENT PROGRAM
6	§ -1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to
7	establish the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument program
8	to coordinate and fulfill the State's role and responsibilities
9	in co-managing the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument.
10	§ -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
11	"Board" means the board of land and natural resources.
12	"Department" means the department of land and natural
13	resources.
14	"Monument" means the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National
15	Monument as established by Presidential Proclamation 8031 on
16	June 15, 2006 (71 Fed. Reg. 36443), under the authority of the
17	Antiquities Act (16 U.S.C. 431).

- 1 "Program" means the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National
- 2 Monument program.
- 3 § -3 Lead agency. The department is designated as the
- 4 lead agency of the State to co-manage the monument in accordance
- 5 with Presidential Proclamation 8031 on June 15, 2006 (71 Fed.
- 6 Reg. 36443) and the December 8, 2006, memorandum of agreement
- 7 between the department; United States Department of the
- 8 Interior, United States Fish and Wildlife Service; and the
- 9 United States Department of Commerce, National Oceanic and
- 10 Atmospheric Administration. In this role, the department
- 11 exercises stewardship responsibility for managing,
- 12 administering, and exercising control over lands, waters, and
- 13 natural resources within the State's jurisdiction. As the lead
- 14 agency for the State, the department will also collaborate with
- 15 the office of Hawaiian affairs in the perpetuation of Hawaiian
- 16 cultural resources within the monument, including the customary
- 17 and traditional rights and practices of native Hawaiians
- 18 exercised for subsistence, cultural, and religious purposes
- 19 under section 7 of article XII of the Hawaii State Constitution.
- 20 § -4 Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument program.
- 21 There is established the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National

2	of aquation	c resources to coordinate and fulfill the State's
3	managemen	t responsibilities of the monument. The program may:
4	(1)	Issue permits as part of the co-trustee monument
5		permit process consistent with applicable state laws,
6		the Presidential Proclamation 8031 on June 15, 2006
7		(71 Fed. Reg. 36443), and 50 C.F.R. part 404;
8	(2)	Provide advice and recommendations to the governor,
9		the department, and other state departments and
10		agencies on any matter relating to the management of
11		the monument;
12	(3)	Solicit and accept grants, donations, and
13		contributions to support the purposes of this chapter
14		and
15	(4)	Adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to effectuate this
16		chapter.
17	S	-5 Fees. The department may charge fees that are
18	proportio	nal to the nature and complexity of the projects or
19	services	performed by the program, such as the issuance of
20	permits;	provided that:

1	(1)	Fees shall be charged in accordance with a schedule
2		approved by the board;
3	(2)	The proposed fee schedule shall be posted on the
4		department's website at least forty-five days prior to
5		the board meeting at which adoption will be
6		considered;
7	(3)	The board shall consider and adopt the fee schedule at
8		a regular meeting after taking public testimony; and
9	(4)	The setting of fees shall not be subject to chapter
10		91.
11	S	-6 Penalties. (a) Any person violating any provision
12	of any ru	le adopted hereunder, including any term or condition
13	of any pe	rmit issued under this chapter, shall be guilty of a
14	petty mis	demeanor and, in addition to any other penalties, shall
15	be fined	not less than:
16	(1)	\$250 for a first offense;
17	(2)	\$500 for a second offense; and
18	(3)	\$1,000 for a third or subsequent offense.
19	(b)	The fines specified in this section shall not be
	(2)	\$500 for a second offense; and
19	(b)	The fines specified in this section shall not be

suspended or waived.

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- 1 (c) Any criminal or administrative action taken under this
- 2 chapter shall not preclude the State from pursuing any other
- 3 criminal action or forfeiture proceeding otherwise provided by
- 4 law.
- 5 (d) Except as otherwise provided by law, the board or its
- 6 duly authorized representative by delegation may impose general
- 7 administrative penalties as provided by section 187A-12.5."
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 9 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 10 begun before its effective date.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Establishes the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument Program within the Division of Aquatic Resources of the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR). Establishes criminal and administrative penalties. Allows DLNR to establish a fee schedule for services provided by the Monument Program. Provides for advice to the Governor and other state agencies regarding the Monument. Allows the Monument Program to solicit and accept grants and donations. (HB629 HD1)

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
