

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to repeal and amend
- 2 sections of part VIII of Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004,
- 3 and transfer certain functions of the department of education to
- 4 the department of accounting and general services and the
- 5 department of human resources development, respectively.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 36-35, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 1. By amending subsections (a) and (b) to read:
- 9 "(a) There is created in the state general fund under [EDN
- 10 400 (school support)] AGS 807 (school r&m, neighbor island
- 11 districts) the state educational facilities repair and
- 12 maintenance account, into which shall be deposited legislative
- 13 appropriations to the account designated for use solely to
- 14 eliminate the backlog of school repair and maintenance projects,
- 15 including the repair or replacement of fixtures, furnishings,
- 16 and equipment, existing on June 30, 2000. Expenditures from the
- 17 account shall be subject to sections 37-31 and 37-33 to 37-40.



- 1 Based on the prioritization approved by the department of
- 2 education, appropriations or authorizations from the account
- 3 shall be expended by the [superintendent of education.]
- 4 comptroller.
- 5 (b) The department of education, with the assistance of
- 6 the department of accounting and general services, shall review
- 7 the existing condition of school facilities and establish
- 8 specific vision plans for each school complex based on current
- 9 repair and maintenance requirements and overall repair and
- 10 maintenance priorities."
- 11 2. By amending subsections (e), (f), and (g) to read:
- 12 "(e) The expenditure of funds for any project with an
- 13 estimated total cost of less than \$100,000 shall be exempt from
- 14 section 464-4; provided that:
- 15 (1) The [superintendent of education] comptroller shall
- develop internal policies and procedures for the
- 17 procurement of goods, services, and construction,
- 18 consistent with the goals of public accountability and
- 19 public procurement practices;
- 20 (2) Insofar as is practical, and based on specifications
- 21 developed, adequate and reasonable competition of no

1		fewer than three proposals shall be solicited for each
2		project, based on rules adopted by the [superintendent
3		of education; comptroller;
4	(3)	Considering all factors, including quality, warranty,
<b>5</b> .		and delivery, the award shall be made to the vendor
6		with the most advantageous proposal;
7	(4)	The procurement requirements shall not be artificially
8		divided or parceled so as to avoid competitive bidding
9		or competitive proposals; and
10	(5)	Formal design for projects shall be done when there is
11	,	a clear need to preserve structural integrity, health
12		and safety, or to clearly communicate construction
13		requirements.
14	For	all projects, the [superintendent of education]
15	comptroll	er shall develop a strategy for the efficient and cost-
16	effective	use of government and private-sector workforces and
17	consider	increased flexibility through public-private
18	partnerin	g, design-build options, cost plus, job order
19	contracts	, performance-based contracts, request for proposals,
20	and any o	ther means to improve communications and accelerate
21	repairs w	hile preserving the quality of the repairs.

1	(f) The [superintendent of education] comptroller shall
2	ensure that all repair and maintenance projects achieve maximum
3	cost-efficiency by emphasizing functional or performance
4	criteria, uniformity of design, and commonality of products, and
5	by avoiding unique or custom requirements that increase costs.
6	The [superintendent of education] comptroller shall develop
7	project specifications based on generic specifications or
8	prescriptive specifications using standard commercial products.
9	Prescriptive specifications may include a qualified product
10	list.
11	For the purposes of this subsection:
12	"Generic specification" means a technical specification
13	that is written in a clear, unambiguous, and nonrestrictive
14	manner establishing:
15	(1) Design, performance, or functional requirements to
16	identify the work to be performed; and
17	(2) Material standards to be used on a project.
18	"Prescriptive specification" means a technical

specification:

1	(1) Establishing that the required work to be performed is
2	written in a clear, unambiguous, and nonrestrictive
3	manner; and
4	(2) Listing manufacturers or products that are acceptable
5	for use on the project.
6	"Standard commercial product" means a product or material
7	that in the normal course of business is customarily maintained
8	in stock by, or readily available for marketing from a
9	manufacturer, distributor, or dealer.
10	This subsection shall not apply to any school facility
11	designated a historic property pursuant to section 6E-5.5.
12	(g) The [superintendent of education] comptroller shall
13	submit an annual report to the legislature, which shall include
.14	a financial statement of the account and the status of repair
15	and maintenance projects undertaken pursuant to this section, no
16	later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
17	session. Expenditures for repair and maintenance projects
18	undertaken pursuant to this section shall be posted
19	electronically on the Internet by the department of [education]
20	accounting and general services within thirty days of each
21	myologila gompletion "

SECTION 3. Section 36-36, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read: There is created in the state general fund under [EDN 4 "(a) 400 (school support)] AGS 807 (school r&m, neighbor island 5 districts) the school physical plant operations and maintenance 6 account, into which shall be deposited all legislative 7 appropriations to the account. 8 The moneys in the account shall be used solely for school 9 repairs and preventive maintenance projects scheduled after 10 June 30, 2001. Expenditures from the account shall be subject 11 to sections 37-31 and 37-33 to 37-40. Based on the 12 prioritization approved by the department of education, 13 appropriations or authorizations from the account shall be 14 expended by the [superintendent of education.] comptroller." 15 2. By amending subsections (d) and (e) to read: 16 "(d) The expenditure of funds made under this Act for any 17 project with an estimated total cost of less than \$100,000 shall 18 be exempt from section 464-4; provided that: 19 (1) The [superintendent of education] comptroller shall

develop internal policies and procedures for the

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1		procurement of goods, services, and construction,
2		consistent with the goals of public accountability and
3		public procurement practices, subject to chapter 103D;
4	(2)	Insofar as is practical, and based on specifications
5		developed, adequate and reasonable competition of no
6		fewer than three quotations shall be solicited for
7		each project based on rules adopted by the
8		[superintendent of education;] comptroller;
9	(3)	Considering all factors, including quality, warranty,
10		and delivery, the award shall be made to the vendor
11		with the most advantageous quotation;
12	(4)	The procurement requirements shall not be artificially
13		divided or parceled so as to avoid competitive bidding
14		or competitive proposals; and
15	(5)	Formal design for projects shall be done when there is
16		a clear need to preserve structural integrity, health
17		and safety, or to clearly communicate construction
18		requirements.
19	(e)	The department of accounting and general services
20	shall ann	ually post on its website information related to a
21	financial	statement of the account and the status of school

- 1 repair and preventive maintenance projects undertaken pursuant
- 2 to this section, no later than twenty days prior to the
- 3 convening of each regular session. The department of
- 4 [education] accounting and general services shall also post the
- 5 following information on its website and update the information
- 6 quarterly:
- 7 (1) Expenditures for school repair and preventive
- 8 maintenance projects undertaken pursuant to this
- 9 section, shall be posted within thirty days of each
- 10 project's completion; and
- 11 (2) A list of each school's repair and maintenance needs
- to be undertaken."
- 13 SECTION 4. Section 37-41.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 "\$37-41.5 Department of education; carryover of funds.
- 16 (a) The department of education may retain up to five per cent
- 17 of any appropriation, except for appropriations to fund
- 18 financing agreements entered into in accordance with chapter
- 19 37D, for the school based budgeting program EDN 100 and for the
- 20 special education and student support services program EDN 150
- 21 at the close of a fiscal year and the funds retained shall not

1	lapse unt	il June 30 of the first fiscal year of the next fiscal
2	biennium.	The department of education shall submit:
3	(1)	A report to the director of finance ninety days after
4		the close of each fiscal year, which shall be prepared
5		in the form prescribed by the director of finance and
6		shall identify the total amount of funds that will
7		carry over to the next fiscal year; and
8	(2)	A copy of this report to the legislature, as well as a
9		report identifying the carryover of funds on a school-
10		by-school basis, at least twenty days prior to the

19	allocated	; provided that the retention of an appropriation shall

not be used by the department as a basis for reducing a school's

future budget requirements."

1 This section shall not apply to the Hawaii state 2 public library system and its employees. 3 SECTION 15. Effective July 1, 2015, all appropriations, 4 records, equipment, machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, 5 papers, documents, maps, and other personal property heretofore 6 made, used, acquired, or held by the department of education relating to the functions transferred to the department of 7 accounting and general services and the department of human 8 9 services development, respectively, shall be transferred with the functions to which they relate. 10 SECTION 16. Effective July 1, 2015, all employees who 11 occupy civil service positions and whose functions are 12 13 transferred to the department of accounting and general services and the department of human resources, respectively, by this Act 14 shall retain their civil service status, whether permanent or 15 temporary. Employees shall be transferred without loss of 16 17 salary, seniority (except as prescribed by applicable collective

bargaining agreements), retention points, prior service credit,

any vacation and sick leave credits previously earned, and other

personnel laws and this Act; provided that the employees possess

rights, benefits, and privileges, in accordance with state

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- 1 the minimum qualifications and public employment requirements
- 2 for the class or position to which transferred or appointed, as
- 3 applicable; provided further that subsequent changes in status
- 4 may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and
- 5 compensation laws.
- 6 Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil
- 7 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may
- 8 retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed
- 9 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An
- 10 exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer
- 11 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits
- 12 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a
- 13 consequence of this Act; provided that the employees possess
- 14 legal and public employment requirements for the position to
- 15 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further
- 16 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to
- 17 applicable employment and compensation laws. The comptroller
- 18 and the director of human resources development, respectively,
- 19 may prescribe the duties and qualifications of these employees
- 20 and fix their salaries without regard to chapter 76, Hawaii
- 21 Revised Statutes.

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#### Report Title:

DOE; DAGS; DHRD; State Educational Facilities; Government Operations

#### Description:

Repeals sections of part VIII, Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014. Transfers rights and resources related to capital improvement programs, repair and maintenance functions, and operation of a central human resources system for DOE employees from DOE to DAGS and DHRD, respectively.

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
