

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1 | SECTION 1. Section 368-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is |
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| 2 | amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows: |
| 3 | "(e) [$\frac{\text{Where}}{\text{When}}$ the executive director has determined |
| 4 | that there is reasonable cause to believe that an unlawful |
| 5 | discriminatory practice has occurred and has been unable to |
| 6 | secure from the respondent a conciliation agreement acceptable |
| 7 | to the commission within one-hundred and eighty days of the |
| 8 | filing of the complaint unless the commission has granted an |
| 9 | extension of time, the executive director [shall], in the |
| 0 | executive director's discretion, may: |
| 1 | (1) [demand] Demand that the respondent cease the unlawful |
| 2 | discriminatory practice[-]; or |
| 13 | (2) Dismiss the complaint and issue a notice to the |
| [4 | complainant indicating that the complainant may bring |
| 15 | a civil action as provided under 368-12. |
| 16 | The executive director's determination that a final |
| 17 | conciliation demand is to be made shall be subject to |
| 18 | reconsideration by the commission on its own initiative but |
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- 1 shall not be subject to judicial review. The executive director
- 2 may demand appropriate affirmative action as, in the judgment of
- 3 the executive director, will effectuate the purpose of this
- 4 chapter, and include a requirement for reporting on the manner
- 5 of compliance.
- 6 The executive director's determination that a complaint is
- 7 to be dismissed and a notice of right to sue issued shall not be
- 8 subject to reconsideration by the commission or judicial
- 9 review."
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
