A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 304A-402, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$304A-402[+] Residence for tuition purposes; basic rule. The board of regents shall adopt [the necessary] rules 4 5 defining residence for tuition purposes herein; provided that 6 the basic rule shall be that a student shall qualify for the 7 resident tuition fee [only] if the following criteria are met: 8 (1)The adult student, or in the case of a minor student, 9 the student's parents or quardians, has or have been a 10 bona fide resident of this State for at least twelve 11 consecutive months next preceding the student's first day of officially scheduled instruction for any 12 13 semester or term in which the student is enrolling at 14 the particular college or campus; and 15 (2)The adult or minor student has not been claimed as a 16 dependent for tax purposes for at least twelve months 17 next preceding the student's first day of officially

1 scheduled instruction for any semester or term in 2 which the student is enrolling at the particular 3 college or campus by the student's parents or 4 quardians who are nonresidents of the State; provided 5 that this provision shall not apply in cases where the 6 parent claiming the student as a dependent is entitled 7 to do so under a child support order or agreement 8 issued or entered into in conjunction with a divorce 9 proceeding or legal separation agreement and the other 10 parent and the student meet the criteria set forth in 11 paragraph (1)[-]; 12 provided that the residency requirements of this section shall not apply to a student who meets the qualifications of section 13 14 304A-502(c)." 15 SECTION 2. Section 304A-502, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

16 amended to read as follows:

17 "[f]\$304A-502[] Power of regents to grant tuition] <u>Tuition</u>
18 waivers. (a) The board of regents, or its designated
19 representatives, [is authorized to] may grant, modify, or
20 suspend tuition waivers.

(b) The board may:

5		officials of any other state or foreign country to
6		provide for reciprocal waiver of the nonresident

9		selected students from Pacific and Asian jurisdictions
10		when their presence would be beneficial to the
11		university or the State;
12	(4)	Waive entirely or reduce the tuition fee or any of the
13		other fees for students, resident or nonresident; and
14	(5)	Waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for
15		members in good standing of the following military
16		units, regardless of their actual state of residence:
17		(A) The Hawaii national guard; and
18		(B) The federal reserve components of the <u>United</u>
19		States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and
20		Coast Guard who attend drills with units located
21		within the State.



1	<u>(c)</u>	Beginning with the 2015-2016 academic year, the board		
2	<u>shall wai</u>	ve the nonresident tuition and fee differential for a		
3	student who is at the time of enrollment an active duty member			
4	of the armed services of the United States and stationed in this			
5	State, or:			
6	(1)	Has served in the armed forces of the United States		
7		for not less than two years;		
8	(2)	Was relieved or discharged from that service with an		
9		honorable discharge;		
10	<u>(3)</u>	Enters any University of Hawaii campus, including any		
11		community college, within one year of the date of		
12		separation from the armed forces of the United States;		
13		and		
14	(4)	Provides proof that the student has established a		
15		physical presence in Hawaii within one year of being		
16		enrolled at the University of Hawaii campus, including		
17		any community college.		
18	<u>(d)</u>	Any person who served in the armed forces of the		
19	United St	ates and who receives federal tuition benefits in		
20	<u>excess of</u>	the tuition and fees the person is charged at a		
21	University of Hawaii campus, including any community college,

shall pay tuition and fees equal to the federal tuition benefits
 received.

3 (e) The board shall determine the percentage of allowable
4 tuition and fee waivers for financial need and other university
5 priorities. These tuition waivers and waivers of the
6 nonresident tuition and fee differential shall be awarded in
7 accordance with guidelines established by the board."
8 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
