

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTRACTORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that under current law,
- 2 licensed general contractors are permitted to act as specialty
- 3 licensed contractors without also being licensed as specialty
- 4 contractors. Specialty contractor licenses are intended to
- 5 ensure that the work meets industry standards for each
- 6 specialty. The legislature further finds that allowing general
- 7 contractors to perform specialty work without being specifically
- 8 licensed to do so poses a risk to public safety.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to require general engineering
- 10 contractors and general building contractors to engage
- 11 subcontractors with appropriate specialty licenses to perform
- 12 incidental work.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 444-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 15 and to read as follows:
- ""Incidental work" means any work directly related to a
- 17 larger or major project or operation that requires a specialty



- 1 contractor license held by a general engineering contractor,
- 2 general building contractor, or specialty contractor and for
- 3 which the aggregate subcontract price for labor, materials,
- 4 taxes, and all other items is not more than the lesser of one
- 5 per cent of the total contract or \$100,000."
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 444-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:
- 8 "(b) A general engineering contractor is a contractor
- 9 whose principal contracting business is in connection with fixed
- 10 works requiring specialized engineering knowledge and skill,
- 11 including the following divisions or subjects: irrigation,
- 12 drainage, water power, water supply, flood control, inland
- 13 waterways, harbors, docks and wharves, shipyards and ports, dams
- 14 and hydroelectric projects, levees, river control and
- 15 reclamation works, railroads, highways, streets and roads,
- 16 tunnels, airports and airways, sewers and sewage disposal plants
- 17 and systems, waste reduction plants, bridges, overpasses,
- 18 underpasses and other similar works, pipelines and other systems
- 19 for the transmission of petroleum and other liquid or gaseous
- 20 substances, parks, playgrounds and other recreational works,
- 21 refineries, chemical plants and similar industrial plants

- 1 requiring specialized engineering knowledge and skill,
- 2 powerhouses, power plants and other utility plants and
- 3 installations, mines and metallurgical plants, land [levelling]
- 4 leveling and earth-moving projects, excavating, grading,
- 5 trenching, paving and surfacing work and cement and concrete
- 6 works in connection with the above mentioned fixed works.
- 7 A general engineering contractor shall engage
- 8 subcontractors that hold appropriate specialty licenses to
- 9 perform incidental work.
- 10 (c) A general building contractor is a contractor whose
- 11 principal contracting business is in connection with any
- 12 structure built, being built, or to be built, for the support,
- 13 shelter, and enclosure of persons, animals, chattels, or movable
- 14 property of any kind, requiring in its construction the use of
- 15 more than two unrelated building trades or crafts, or to do or
- 16 superintend the whole or any part thereof.
- 17 A general building contractor shall engage subcontractors
- 18 that hold appropriate specialty licenses to perform incidental
- 19 work."
- 20 SECTION 4. Section 444-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:

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- 2 of this chapter shall act, or assume to act, or advertise, as
- 3 general engineering contractor, general building contractor, or
- 4 specialty contractor without a license previously obtained under
- 5 and in compliance with this chapter and the rules and
- 6 regulations of the contractors license board.
- 7 A general engineering contractor or general building
- 8 contractor shall not perform incidental work and supplemental
- 9 work."
- 10 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Contractors; Licensing; Specialty Contractors; Incidental Work

Description:

Prohibits general engineering contractors and general building contractors from performing incidental or supplemental work. Requires general engineering contractors and general building contractors to engage an appropriate specialty contractor to perform incidental work. Defines incidental work.

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
