### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SERVICE BY PUBLICATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the manner in which		
2	a summons for a civil action is published in Hawaii should be		
3	consistent with the publication requirements for other types of		
4	notices.		
5	The purpose of this Act is to clarify the requirements for		
6	service by publication.		
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 634, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
8	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
9	and to read as follows:		
10	"§634- Service by publication. (a) The court may		
11	order that service of the summons be made by publication when:		
12	(1) Service of a summons is required by law, court rule,		
13	or court order;		
14	(2) Service of the summons on a defendant by personal		
15	delivery or by certified, registered, or express mail		
16	is not successful, despite a reasonable attempt; and		

1	(3)	The facts appear by affidavit, declaration, or
2		otherwise to the satisfaction of the court.
3	(b)	Service of the summons by publication may be:
4	(1)	In a newspaper published in the State and having a
5		general circulation in the circuit in which the action
6	·	has been filed. The summons shall be published once
7		each week for three consecutive weeks, which shall
8		constitute three publications. The third publication
9		shall be at least twenty-one days before the return
10		date stated in the summons; or
11	(2)	On a state website, at the discretion of the agency
12		that maintains the website, in a manner and for such
13		time as the court may order, but at least twenty-one
14		days before the return date stated in the summons;
15		provided that the summons shall also be published at
16		least once in a newspaper described in paragraph (1)
17		at least twenty-one days before the return date.
18	(c)	As used in this section, "general circulation" refers
19	to a news	paper that:
20	(1)	Contains news of a general nature; and

1	(2) <u>Is d</u>	istributed within the circuit in which the action	
2	has	been filed:	
3	(A)	At least weekly;	
4	(B)	For a minimum of one year unless interrupted by	
5		strike, natural disaster, or act of war or	
6		terror; and	
7	<u>(C)</u>	To a minimum of three per cent of the residents	
8		of the circuit, as determined by the last	
9		decennial United States census and as verified by	
10		an independent audit."	
11	SECTION 3	. Section 482-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
12	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		
13	"(b) In any action brought against a registrant that is a		
14	nonresident of this State, service may be effected pursuant to		
15	sections 634-35, [and] 634-36[-], and 634"		
16	SECTION 4	. Section 604-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
17	amended by ame	nding subsection (c) to read as follows:	
18	"(c) A s	ummons or other writ issued by a district court	
19	may be served	anywhere within the State. A summons or other	
20	writ issued by	a district court may be served without the State	

1 in accordance with section 634-24, 634-25, 634-34, 634-35, [or] 2 634-36[+], or 634- ." 3 SECTION 5. Section 634-33, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "§634-33 Service in cases of operation of motor vehicles. 6 The use and operation by any person, whether a resident or a nonresident of the State, of any motor vehicle upon a public 7 8 highway in this State shall subject the person to the 9 jurisdiction of the courts of this State in any action or 10 proceeding against the person growing out of any accident or 11 collision in which the person and the motor vehicle so used and 12 operated may be involved. The use and operation of the motor **13** vehicle is deemed a signification of the person's agreement that 14 any summons against the person which is served is of the same 15 legal force and validity as if served upon the person personally 16 within this State, whether the person is a nonresident of this State or at the time a cause of action arises is a resident of 17 18 this State but subsequently becomes a nonresident of this State. 19 Service of such summons is to be made as provided by [section] 20 sections  $634-36[_{7}]$  and 634- , if the defendant cannot be found 21 in the State.

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         This section shall not be construed as repealing or
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    amending any other provision of law relating to the service of
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    process nor as establishing an exclusive method of service of
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    process in cases to which this section may apply."
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         SECTION 6. Section 634-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "§634-34 Service on boat operators. The operation,
    navigation, use, or maintenance by any person, whether a
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    resident or nonresident of the State, of any boat, ship, barge,
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    or other watercraft in the navigable waters of the State shall
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    subject the person to the jurisdiction of the courts of this
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    State in any action or proceeding against the person growing out
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    of any accident, collision, or claim for damages in which the
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    person and the boat, ship, barge, or other watercraft may be
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    involved in the navigable waters. The operation, navigation,
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    use, or maintenance is deemed a signification of the person's
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    agreement that any summons against the person which is served is
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    of the same legal force and validity as if served upon the
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    person personally within this State, whether the person is a
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    nonresident of this State or at the time a cause of action
   arises is a resident of this State but subsequently becomes a
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- 1 nonresident of this State. Service of the summons is to be made
- 2 as provided by [section] sections 634-36[7] and 634- , if the
- 3 defendant cannot be found in the State.
- 4 This section shall not be construed as repealing or
- 5 amending any other provision of law relating to the service of
- 6 process nor as establishing an exclusive method of service of
- 7 process in cases to which this section may apply."
- 8 SECTION 7. Section 634-35, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 10 "(b) Service of process upon any person who is subject to
- 11 the jurisdiction of the courts of this State, as provided in
- 12 this section, may be made as provided by [section] sections 634-
- 13 36[-7] and 634-, if the person cannot be found in the State,
- 14 with the same force and effect as though summons had been
- 15 personally served within this State."
- 16 SECTION 8. Section 634-36, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 "§634-36 Manner of service under sections 634-33 to 35.
- 19 When service of summons is provided for by section 634-33, 634-
- 20 34, or 634-35, service shall be made by service upon the
- 21 defendant personally by any person authorized to serve process

1 in the place in which the defendant may be found or appointed by 2 the court for the purpose, or sent by certified, registered, or 3 express mail, postage prepaid, with return receipt requested, by 4 the plaintiff or the plaintiff's attorney to the defendant. The 5 plaintiff or the plaintiff's attorney shall file the return of 6 the serving officer or an affidavit showing that the copy of 7 summons and complaint were served as aforesaid or sent by 8 certified, registered, or express mail as aforesaid, and in the 9 latter case the return receipt signed by the defendant shall be 10 filed with the affidavit. The service shall be complete upon 11 delivery of the required papers to the defendant outside the 12 State, personally or by mail as provided. 13 [If the defendant cannot be found to serve or mail the 14 summons and the facts shall appear by affidavit or otherwise to 15 the satisfaction of the court, it may order that-service be made 16 by publication of summons in at least one newspaper published in 17 the State and having a general circulation in the circuit in 18 which the action has been instituted, in such manner and for 19 such time as the court may order, but not less than once each week-in-four-successive weeks, the-last-publication to be not 20 21 less than twenty one days-prior to the return-date-stated

- 1 therein unless a different time is prescribed by order of the
- 2 court.] "
- 3 SECTION 9. Section 667-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending the definition of "serve" to read as
- 5 follows:
- 6 "Serve", when referring to providing notice of intention to
- 7 foreclose or notice of default and intention to foreclose
- 8 pursuant to a nonjudicial foreclosure, means to have service of
- 9 the notice of default and intention to foreclose made in
- 10 accordance with the service of process or the service of summons
- 11 under the Hawaii rules of civil procedure and under sections
- 12 634-35, [and] 634-36, and 634- , excluding however, any return
- 13 or affidavit of service obligations required therein."
- 14 SECTION 10. This Act does not affect rights and duties
- 15 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
- 16 were begun before its effective date.
- 17 SECTION 11. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
