- 3 §183-B Destruction or harvesting of sandalwood trees. (a)
- 4 It shall be unlawful to destroy or harvest a tree of a native
- 5 sandalwood species that is determined by the department to have
- 6 been in existence prior to the year 1778.
- 7 (b) It shall be unlawful to destroy or harvest a tree of a
- 8 native sandalwood species not described in subsection (a)
- 9 without a license issued by the department.
- 10 (c) Any person who destroys or harvests a native
- 11 sandalwood species tree shall replant native sandalwood species
- 12 trees in an amount equal to the total estimated age of all trees

- 6 and deposited are appropriated for those purposes.
- 7 §183-D Criminal penalties. Any person who violates
- 8 section 183-B, upon conviction thereof, is guilty of a
- 9 misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$ or
- 10 imprisoned not more than one year, or both. In addition to any
- 11 other penalty imposed under this section, a fine of up to

- 14 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 15 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 16 begun before its effective date.
- 17 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 18 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 19 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 20 the new sections in this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
