A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ELDERLY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The nation-wide trend toward an aging
2	population is evident in Hawaii. Projections estimate that by
3	2030 the elderly population will represent twenty per cent of
4	the populations for each county, as well as the State as a
5	whole: one out of every five individuals statewide will be aged
6	sixty-five or older. To address this growing population, the
7	mayor of the city and county of Honolulu has joined the network
8	of age-friendly cities and communities program by establishing
9	an age-friendly city initiative.
10	Age is the single most important factor influencing health
11	status and the need and demand for health care resources. For
12	the elderly, there is a clear relationship between age and
13	mortality, prevalence of chronic conditions, and level of
14	disability. Accordingly, the elderly are the heaviest users of
15	health care resources.
16	Establishing senior playgrounds near children's playgrounds

is a trend that is being used by an increasing number of states

to keep elderly individuals healthy. Playgrounds designed as

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- 1 fitness parks to keep seniors active and reduce their propensity
- 2 to fall through opportunities to work on balance and dexterity
- 3 address many health needs of older individuals. These fitness
- 4 parks offer opportunities for active exercise and serve as
- 5 preventative care to the propensity for falls, which alone are
- 6 estimated to represent \$19,000,000,000 in annual health care
- 7 costs, a number expected to increase to \$55,000,000,000 by 2020.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to join the mayor of the city
- 9 and county of Honolulu's age-friendly city initiative by
- 10 partnering with the city and county of Honolulu to establish a
- 11 three-year intergenerational playground pilot program to address
- 12 the health needs of Hawaii's growing elderly population.
- 13 SECTION 2. (a) The executive office on aging, in
- 14 collaboration with the city and county of Honolulu, shall
- 15 establish a three-year intergenerational playground pilot
- 16 program.
- 17 (b) The intergenerational playground pilot program shall
- 18 identify an existing playground within the city and county of
- 19 Honolulu that can be modified to become an intergenerational
- 20 playground utilized by individuals of all ages including
- 21 seniors.

4	SECT	ION 3. The executive office on aging, in consultation	
5	with the	city and county of Honolulu, shall submit a progress	
6	report of	the intergenerational playground pilot program to the	
7	legislatu	re and the mayor of the city and county of Honolulu no	
8	later tha	n twenty days prior to the convening of the 2016, 2017,	
9	and 2018 regular sessions. After the final year of the		
10	intergenerational playground pilot program, a final report shall		
11	be submit	ted to the legislature no later than twenty days prior	
12	to the co	nvening of the regular session of 2019, to include:	
13	(1)	Factors used to determine the location of the	
14		intergenerational playground;	
15	(2)	Costs of the program, including design, equipment, and	
16		construction costs;	
17	(3)	Annual cost of the program, including information on	
18		the durability of intergenerational playground	
19		equipment and repair and maintenance costs of the	
20		playground;	

1	(4)	Potential liability issues associated with the	
2		intergenerational playground, if any;	
3	(5)	Recommendations regarding the continuation or	
4		expansion of the intergenerational playground pilot	
5		program, including estimated costs to plan, design,	
6		construct, and maintain any additional playgrounds, as	
7		well as the counties in which the additional	
8		playgrounds will be established;	
9	(6)	Recommendations to incorporate the intergenerational	
10		playground pilot program in the Hawaii state plan on	
11		aging; and	
12	(7)	Recommendations regarding any necessary legislation	
13		for the continuation or expansion of the	
14		intergenerational playground pilot program.	
15	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general	
16	revenues o	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
17	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 for		
18	the inter	generational playground pilot program.	
19	The s	sum appropriated shall be expended by the executive	
20	office on	aging for the purposes of this Act.	

- 1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050, and
- 2 shall be repealed on June 30, 2019.
