A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that early childhood education helps build physical, linguistic, cognitive, and 2 3 social skills in children and can prepare a person for success 4 in life. The HighScope Perry Preschool Study found that 5 children enrolled in a quality preschool program became adults who were more likely to graduate high school, earn a higher 6 salary, and become home owners compared to their peers who were 7 not enrolled in a quality preschool program. This study shows 8 that early childhood education is not just beneficial to the 9 child, but to the entire community. Providing opportunities for 10' some four-year-olds to engage in early learning is an important 11 step toward meeting early childhood education needs in Hawaii. 12 The legislature finds that reinstatement of the junior 13 kindergarten program is necessary in light of the failure of a 14 constitutional amendment that would have allowed state funding 15 to private preschools. There are currently few options for 16 children to attend public school before their fifth birthday. 17

- 1 Reinstating the junior kindergarten program will give any child,
- 2 who turns five between August 1st and January 1st of the school
- 3 year, the chance to enroll in public school at age four and be
- 4 promoted to first grade after completion of one year, if
- 5 appropriate, or continue in kindergarten, if needed. At no
- 6 other time in a child's school years is such flexibility
- 7 available without the social or emotional risk associated with
- 8 keeping a child from being promoted to the next grade. Junior
- 9 kindergarten is a unique opportunity to arm children with
- 10 skills, confidence, and the best preparation possible for first
- 11 grade.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to reinstate the junior
- 13 kindergarten program in the State's public schools.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 302A-411, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 "§302A-411 [Kindergarten] Junior kindergarten and
- 17 kindergarten program; establishment; attendance. (a) The
- 18 department shall establish and maintain junior kindergartens and
- 19 kindergartens with a program of instruction as a part of the
- 20 public school system; provided that:

1	(±)	Accendance in kindergarten shall be mandatory, unless
2		exempted by subsection [\(\frac{(b)}{D}\)] (c) or section 302A-1132
3		and
4	(2)	Charter schools shall not be excluded from mandatory
5		participation in the program.
6	(b)	The department shall establish a two-tier junior
7	kindergar	ten and kindergarten program to support the range of
8	developme	ntal abilities of children in junior kindergarten and
9	kindergar	ten. Schools shall not move students between junior
10	kindergar	ten and kindergarten, except in cases where the
11	movement	is warranted and based on appropriate assessments
12	determine	d by:
13	(1)	A qualified teacher with early childhood education
14		background or experience; and
15	(2)	The formative and summative assessment of a student's
16		academic, physical, social, and emotional abilities,
17	provided	that, beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, the
18	departmen	t shall use successful assessment tools and protocols
19	for deter	mining a student's initial placement and for decision
20	making ab	out a student's movement between tiers and into grade
21	one. Jun	ior kindergarten students may graduate directly to

- 1 grade one when promotion is based on appropriate assessments and
- 2 other progress data collected over time.
- 3 [\frac{\lambda}{b}] (c) Beginning with the 2014-2015 school year, any
- 4 parent, guardian, or other person having the responsibility for,
- 5 or care of, a child who will be at least five years of age on or
- 6 before July 31 of the school year shall enroll the child in a
- 7 public school kindergarten unless the child is enrolled at a
- 8 private school or the child's attendance is otherwise exempt
- 9 under section 302A-1132. Beginning with the 2015-2016 school
- 10 year, any parent, guardian, or other person having the
- 11 responsibility for, or care of, a child who will be at least
- 12 five years of age on or after August 1 and before January 1 of
- 13 the school year may enroll the child in a public school junior
- 14 kindergarten.
- 15 [(c)] (d) The department may accept gifts to establish and
- 16 maintain kindergartens."
- 17 SECTION 3. The department of education shall create a
- 18 strategic plan for the implementation of junior kindergarten
- 19 programs within three years of the effective date of this Act.
- 20 The strategic plan shall include but is not limited to:

1	(1)	A clineline for the implementation of juntor	
2		kindergarten within three years of the effective date	
3		of this Act;	
4	(2)	A list of schools whose facilities can support the	
5		addition of a junior kindergarten program;	
6	(3)	Discussion of the costs associated with implementing	
7	·	junior kindergarten in existing facilities; and	
8	(4)	A list of schools not able to accommodate a junior	
9		kindergarten program in existing facilities, detailing	
10		the infrastructure needs preventing each school from	
11		implementing a junior kindergarten program.	
12	The department of education shall submit a report, including th		
13	strategic plan and any proposed legislation, to the legislature		
14	no later	than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular	
15	session of 2016.		
16	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general		
17	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
18	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and		
19	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal	
20	vear 2016	-2017 for the reinstatement of junior kindergarten	

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- 1 programs in schools that administered junior kindergarten
- 2 programs prior to 2012.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of education for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;

8 provided that section 4 shall take effect on July 1_{ν} 2015.

Report Title:

Public Schools; Early Childhood Education; Junior Kindergarten; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes junior kindergartens to provide schooling for children who turn five between August 1 and January 1 of a given school year, and would otherwise be required to wait until after their fifth birthday to enroll in kindergarten. Requires the department of education to create a strategic plan for implementation of junior kindergarten programs and report findings to the legislature. Appropriates funds for the reinstatement of junior kindergarten programs in schools where the programs were administered prior to 2012.

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
