A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SERVICE CHARGES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that consumers should SECTION 1. 2 know whether or not, and to what extent, the money they pay 3 hotels in porterage service charges is being paid to employees. 4 When a hotel charges service charges to customers, customers may 5 believe that those charges are being paid to employees as tip 6 income; however, this is not necessarily the case. Despite the 7 fact that many employees statewide rely on tips as a crucial 8 supplement to their wages, hotels can retain all or part of those service charges for themselves. When hotels engage in 9 10 this practice, it should be transparent to consumers because 11 this information could influence whether or not a consumer 12 chooses to use porterage services. The information may also be 13 valuable to employees and potential employees of a hotel when 14 making employment decisions.

15 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that hotels either 16 distribute porterage service charges to employees in full or

notify customers that service charges are being used for other 1 2 purposes. 3 SECTION 2. Section 481B-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "[[]§481B-14 Hotel or restaurant service charge; 6 disposition.[]] (a) Any [hotel]: 7 (1) Hotel or restaurant that applies a service charge for 8. the sale of food or beverage services; or 9 Hotel that applies a service charge for porterage (2) 10 services, 11 shall distribute the service charge directly to its employees as tip income or clearly disclose to the purchaser of the services 12 that the service charge is being used to pay for costs or 13 14 expenses other than wages and tips of employees. (b) As used in this section, unless the context requires 15 otherwise, "porterage" includes the act of moving luggage, bags, 16 or parcels between a guest room and a lobby, front desk, or any 17 area with vehicular access at a hotel, hotel-condominium, or 18 19 condominium-hotel as defined in section 486K-1." SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
