# H.B. NO. 917

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding to subpart C of part II a new section to be 3 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 4 "§88- Forfeiture of benefits; felony convictions. (a) If a member, former member, or retirant is convicted of a felony 5 6 and the court finds, by a preponderance of the evidence, that 7 the felony is related to the employment of the member, former 8 member, or retirant by the State or any county, the court may 9 decree, as a civil penalty pursuant to section 706-605(8), a 10 forfeiture by the member, former member, or retirant of all or a 11 portion of any: 12 (1) Interest; 13 Hypothetical account balance in excess of the amount 14 representing any employee contributions made by or on 15 behalf of the member, former member, or retirant; 16 (3) Pension; **17** (4) Annuity; or 18 (5) Retirement allowance

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1 to which the member, former member, or retirant may otherwise be 2 entitled under this chapter; provided that upon the death of the 3 member, former member, or retirant, the designated beneficiary 4 of the member, former member, or retirant may receive benefits 5 to which such beneficiary would otherwise be entitled under this 6 chapter. 7 (b) Upon receipt of a certified copy of the order 8 decreeing forfeiture, the system shall comply with the order and 9 shall reduce, suspend, or deny payment to the member, former 10 member, or retirant as provided in the order until such time as 11 the system receives a certified order to: 12 Increase, resume, or make payments to the member, (1) 13 former member, or retirant; or 14 (2) Quash or reverse the decree of forfeiture. 15 The system shall not be required to make inquiry into the propriety of the order decreeing forfeiture or recoup any 16 **17** payments made to the member, former member, or retirant prior to receipt by the system of the order decreeing forfeiture. 18 19 (c) For the purposes of this section, a felony is "related 20 to the employment" of an employee of the State or a county if 21 the employee uses or attempts to use the employee's official 22 position to commit the felony, including:

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1	(1)	Felonies in which state or county time, equipment, or							
2		other facilities are used in the commission of the							
3		<pre>felony;</pre>							
4	(2)	Bribery;							
5	(3)	Embezzlement, theft, or other unlawful taking,							
6		receiving, retaining, or failing to account properly							
7		for, any property or funds that belong to the State or							
8		any county or any department, bureau, board, or other							
9		agency thereof; or							
10	(4)	A felony committed against a person over whom the							
11		employee, in the course of the employee's duties,							
12		exercises custody or supervision.							
13	(d)	This section shall not impair or diminish benefits							
14	accrued p	rior to the effective date of this section. This							
15	section shall not apply to felonies committed prior to the								
16	effective date of this section.								
17	<u>(e)</u>	This section shall not apply to accrued retirement							
18	benefits that are non-forfeitable pursuant to sections 88-73(f),								
19	88-281(g), and 88-331(f)."

JUSTIFICATION:

This proposal would require the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Hawaii to comply with a court order decreeing a forfeiture of all or a portion of any interest, hypothetical account balance, pension, annuity or retirement allowance otherwise payable to a member, former member, or retirant of the system convicted of a felony if the court finds that the felony committed by the member, former member, or retirant is related to the employment of the member, former member, or retirant by the State or county. proposal does not impair or diminish the accrued retirement benefits of members of Employees' Retirement System protected by article XVI, section 2, of the Hawaii State Constitution. This proposal applies prospectively to benefits accrued after the effective date of the proposal.

proposal also applies only to felonies committed by public employees after the

effective date of the proposal.
