A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AMUSEMENT CONCESSIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y adding a new part to read as follows:
3		"PART . AMUSEMENT CONCESSIONS
4	§261·	Definitions. As used in this part:
5	"Amus	sement concession" means an establishment where a
6	customer :	is authorized to play or operate any slot machine
7	permitted	under this part.
8	"Cust	comer" means a person who:
9	(1)	Is at least twenty-one years of age;
10	(2)	Possesses proof of carriage on an airline flight
11		scheduled to leave the United States within twelve
12		hours; and
13	(3)	Plays or operates any slot machine.
14	"Net	revenue" means gross wagers less the following:
15	(1)	All taxes levied against the amusement concession;

1	(2)	All winnings, including amounts paid in cash or in
2		wagering vouchers by the amusement concession as
3		winnings to customers;
4	(3)	Gross wages, salaries, and fringe benefits paid by the
5		amusement concession to employees; and
6	(4)	Airport fees and rent paid by the amusement
7		concession.
8	"Slo	t machine" means any mechanical, electrical, or other
9	device, c	ontrivance, or machine that, upon insertion of a coin,
10	token, or	similar object, or upon payment of any consideration,
11	is availa	ble to play or operate, the play or operation of which,
12	whether by	y reason of the skill of the operator in playing a game
13	which is p	presented for play by the machine or application of the
14	element o	f chance, or both, may deliver or entitle the person
15	playing o	r operating the machine to receive cash, premiums,
16	merchandi	se, tokens, or anything of value, whether the payoff is
17	made autor	matically from the machine or in any other manner.
18	§261·	- Airport amusement concessions authorized; license
19	required.	(a) Amusement concessions shall be authorized in
20	airports,	subject to this part.



- 1 (b) No airport establishment shall allow an amusement
- 2 concession unless the establishment holds an amusement
- 3 concession license issued by the department.
- 4 (c) The department may establish a fee for amusement
- 5 concession licenses issued under this part.
- 6 (d) This part shall not be construed to legalize internet
- 7 gambling, electronic bingo games, or other forms of gambling
- 8 under part III of chapter 712 other than play or operation of
- 9 slot machines within airports.
- 10 (e) Chapter 102 shall apply to amusement concessions.
- (f) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
- 12 91 to effectuate the purposes of this part.
- 13 §261- Location. (a) Placement of amusement concessions
- 14 shall be limited to the secured areas of passenger terminals
- 15 within state airports.
- 16 (b) The department may provide premises within the airport
- 17 to any amusement concession for administration, storage, slot
- 18 machine repair, and other business purposes.
- 19 (c) No slot machine, whether in operation or under repair,
- 20 shall be visible from any public thoroughfare.

- 1 §261- Advertising prohibited. It shall be unlawful to
- 2 publish, broadcast, or otherwise disseminate within this State,
- 3 advertising for or on behalf of any amusement concession.
- 4 §261- Taxation. (a) Amusement concessions and
- 5 customers shall be subject to taxation on all income realized
- 6 from any amusement concession device, including taxes
- 7 established pursuant to chapter 235.
- 8 (b) An amusement concession shall withhold payment of a
- 9 portion of a customer's winnings, as determined by the
- 10 department, equal to the expected taxes owed by the customer.
- 11 §261- Allocation of proceeds. (a) Each fiscal year,
- 12 each amusement concession shall pay to the State eighty-six per
- 13 cent of the net revenues or the minimum annual guarantee
- 14 established by the department, whichever is greater.
- (b) All amounts paid to the State pursuant to this part
- 16 shall be deposited into the airport revenue fund established
- 17 pursuant to section 248-8.
- 18 §261- Records; inspection; audit. An amusement
- 19 concession shall keep records of all operations for purposes of
- 20 enforcement and taxation. The records shall be deemed open to
- 21 inspection and without notice by the state attorney general,



- 1 county prosecutor, department of taxation, and appropriate
- 2 county licensing authority during regular business hours. An
- 3 annual audit of each amusement concession shall be conducted at
- 4 the department's expense. Each annual audit shall be submitted
- 5 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
- 6 convening of each regular session.
- 7 §261- Indemnification. All amusement concessions shall
- 8 indemnify and hold harmless the State of Hawaii, its officers,
- 9 agents, and employees from and against any and all claims
- 10 arising out of or resulting from the operation or playing of any
- 11 slot machine at an amusement concession, including any claims
- 12 arising or resulting from the payout of any winnings. All
- 13 amusement concessions shall procure sufficient insurance to
- 14 provide this indemnification if requested to do so by the
- 15 department.
- 16 §261- Penalty. A person commits the offense of
- 17 gambling if the person knowingly operates or plays a slot
- 18 machine at an airport concession in violation of this chapter.
- 19 The penalty for the offense of gambling shall be the same as in
- 20 section 712-1223; provided that this section shall not apply to

1 any amusement concession or government employees acting in 2 furtherance of their duties." 3 SECTION 2. 20		concessions pursuant to sections 261- to 261

1 The term "airport purpose" or "airport purposes" contained 2 in any governor's executive order transferring jurisdiction and control of real property to the department of transportation 3 4 shall be considered to include entering into contracts, leases, 5 licenses, and other arrangements pursuant to this section. 6 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, in each 7 8 the department may establish the terms and conditions of the 9 contract, lease, license, or other arrangement, and may fix the 10 charges, rentals, or fees for the privileges, services, or 11 things granted, conferred, or made available, for the purpose of 12 meeting the expenditures of the statewide system of airports set 13 forth in section 261-5(a), which includes expenditures for 14 capital improvement projects approved by the legislature. Such 15 charges shall be reasonable and uniform for the same class of 16 privilege, service, or thing." **17** SECTION 4. 12		life, health, or accident insurance[-]; or

Amusement Concessions; Airport; Gambling: Slot Machines

Description:

Authorizes the implementation of amusement concessions to provide slot machines at state airports for departing passengers. Revenues to be deposited into the airport revenue fund.

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
