A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust SECTION 1. 2 fund (EUTF) offers health benefits to the children of state and 3 county employees and retirees. Due to the current construction 4 of chapter 87A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, when an employee or 5 retiree passes away, children of the employee or retiree's 6 surviving spouse that were born after the employee or retiree's 7 death are eligible to participate in benefits plans offered by 8 The legislature finds that a child born after an the fund. 9 employee or retiree's death, who is not the natural child of the 10 deceased employee or retiree, should not be eligible to 11 participate in fund benefits plans because such a child is not 12 the child of the state or county employee or retiree. The 13 legislature also finds that the definition of "dependent-14 beneficiary" should be amended to be consistent with the federal 15 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, which prohibits 16 restricting health insurance coverage to only unmarried



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1	dependents and denying health insurance coverage to married			
2	dependents.			
3	Finally, the legislature finds that continued viability of			
4	the EUTF necessitates the imposition of an enhancement of			
5	benefits moratorium to control health benefit costs.			
6	The purpose of this Act is to:			
7	(1) Provide for a moratorium on benefit enhancements that			
8	increase other post-employment benefits liability			
9	within the EUTF statute; and			
10	(2) Amend the definition of "dependent-beneficiary"			
11	contained in chapter 87A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to			
12	clarify eligibility of children for participation in			
13	fund benefit plans and to bring the definition of			
14	"dependent-beneficiary" into conformance with the			
15	federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.			
16	SECTION 2. Chapter 87A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
17	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
18	and to read as follows:			
19	"§87A- Moratorium on benefit enhancements that increase			
20	other post-employment benefits liability. There shall be no			
21	benefit enhancements under this chapter for retired employee-			



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1	beneficiaries and their eligible dependents until such time as			
2	the actuarial value of the separate trust fund for other post-			
3	employment benefits' assets equals one hundred per cent of the			
4	separate trust fund's actuarial accrued liability; except that			
5	benefit enhancements that do not increase other post-employment			
6	benefits liability or that decrease other post-employment			
7	benefits liability shall be allowed."			
8	SECTION 3. Section 87A-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
9	amended by amending the definition of "dependent-beneficiary" to			
10	read as follows:			
11	""Dependent-beneficiary" means an employee-beneficiary's:			
12	(1) Spouse;			
13	(2) [Unmarried child] <u>Child</u> deemed eligible by the board,			
14	including a legally adopted child, stepchild, foster			
15	child, or recognized natural child who lives with the			
16	employee-beneficiary[+], but excluding a child born			
17	more than ten months after the death of an employee			
18	killed in the performance of duty, born more than ten			
19	months after the death of an active employee who was			
20	eligible to retire on the date of death, or born more			

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1		than ten months after the date of death of a retired
2		employee-beneficiary; and
3	(3)	Unmarried child regardless of age who is incapable of
4		self-support because of a mental or physical
5		incapacity, which existed prior to the unmarried
6		child's reaching the age of nineteen years."
7	SECT	ION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.
